If you are in Adelaide on that date please go along and cheer them on - the address is Freemond High School, Leonard Street, ELIZABETH PARK.



#### LEIGH CREEK PRE-SCHOOL KINDERGARTEN

#### WHAT HAS HAPPENED TO OUR KINDY?

The last 6 months have seen a tremendous change in the LC Pre-school Kindergarten. At first it may not be obvious - but it certainly is to the Tax-man. At last the Kindy Staff are receiving a salary commensurate with their duties and responsibilities. For many years they have only been paid a token amount.

#### HOW HAS THIS HAPPENED?

Late last year after much discussion, the Committee decided to become an Affiliate Kindergarten of the Kindergarten Union (KU) of South Australia. This was possible because State Parliament had passed the Kindergarten Union Act the previous year. Earlier moves to Affiliate founded on a few unsatisfactory parts of the Act prior to 1975.

There are 3 types of Kindergartens - Private, Affiliate and Branch. Each type has various advantages and disadvantages.

The Private Kindergartens are more or less 'on their own' in every way. They receive no financial help from KU and their committees are totally responsible for their Kindies. There are less than 30 private Kindies in SA most of them supported by various private interest groups.

The Affiliate Kindergarten appears to have the best of both worlds. It has a number of beneficial links with the KU and at the same time it retains a large amount of autonomy. Some of the benefits from KU are -

(1) Financial - Salaries for the Staff for the 4-5 age group.

- Grant to cover some operating costs.

Specialist help is available in many fields.

(3) Access to new developments and research in Pre-school education.

The Committee has autonomy in -

Operating the Kindy.

- Appointing Staff.
- Handling finances and providing equipment.

In SA there are about 15 Affiliated Kindergartens.

The Branch Kindergarten is under the complete control of the KU and it has none of the autonomy of the Affiliate Kindy. Over 270 Kindies in SA are Branches of the KU - probably because it is easier for the Committee as the KU assumes the responsibility for staffing, with trained personnel, for the operating costs and for basic equipment, including the Building. The committee raises funds for extras - e.g. Christmas parties, Easter Eggs and extra equip.

The LC Pre-school Kindergarten has changed in two obvious ways, they are:-

(1) A reduction of the fee from \$28 to \$5 for the 4-5 year age groups per term.

The re-arrangement of the timetable for 3-4's now in the afternoon and 4-5's now in the morning.

The former change is possible because the Staff are now paid by the KU and the latter was made because the 4-5 age group should have preference.

All these changes do not mean that the help and interest of parents and friends is no longer needed. The committee realize the Kindy has an important role and task in our Community. The help and interest of parents and friends is needed now as much as it ever was and probably it is even more important - especially as Education - Pre-school or otherwise involves the whole family in a wide variety of ways.

On FRIDAY, 13 May, at 10.am a farewell presentation will be made to Mrs SHIRLEY KNOTT at the Kindergarten. Present and past Mums! and friends are very welcome to attend and a

FAREWELL PRESENTATION plate of morning tea would be appreciated.
