ASIAN NIGHT BAZAAR in the Community HALL on FRIDAY, 20 June. Further details in later issues.

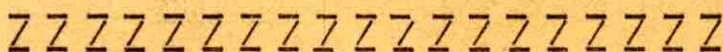
The Group's project for this year is the training and salary for one year of an indigenous agricultural teacher in Sulla, Sylhet District of North-eastern Bangladesh. The people in the district are completely dependant on the rice crop and are trying to diversify into other types of crops.

CAA is a PRACTICAL people-to-people movement working through more than 160 groups in Australia to bring improved health, education and living standards to those in less developed countries.



Attention is brought to the fact that small FLIES and in particular BUSH FLIES are carriers of infection. Most of the problems have either been conjunctivitis (fly bites) or contamination of food. The weather conditions at present are such that one germ may contaminate a whole container of food in a very short period of time. As the small bush fly is almost impossible to prevent they should be rapidly eradicated within the house and furthermore, food left out of cupboards or refrigerators should be immediately covered.

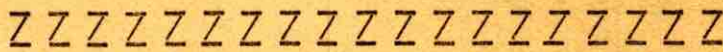


LEIGH CREEK GARBAGE COLLECTION

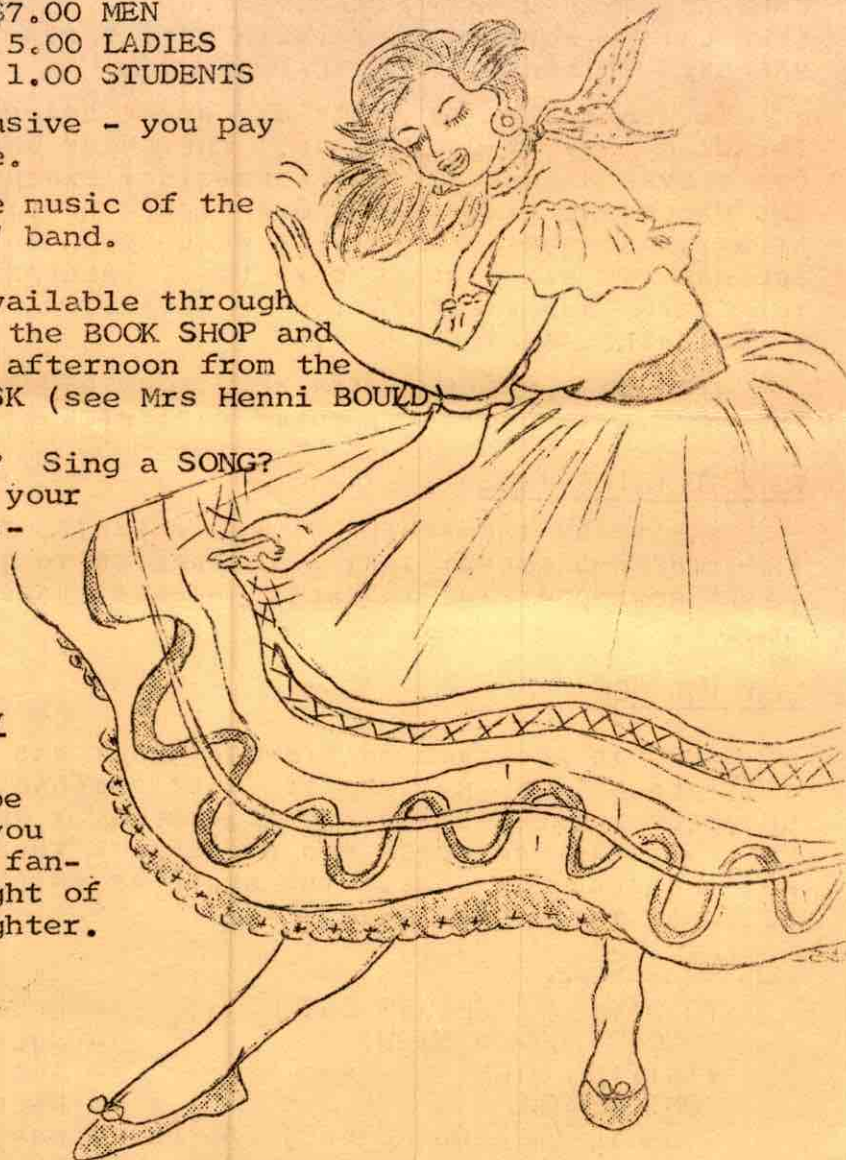

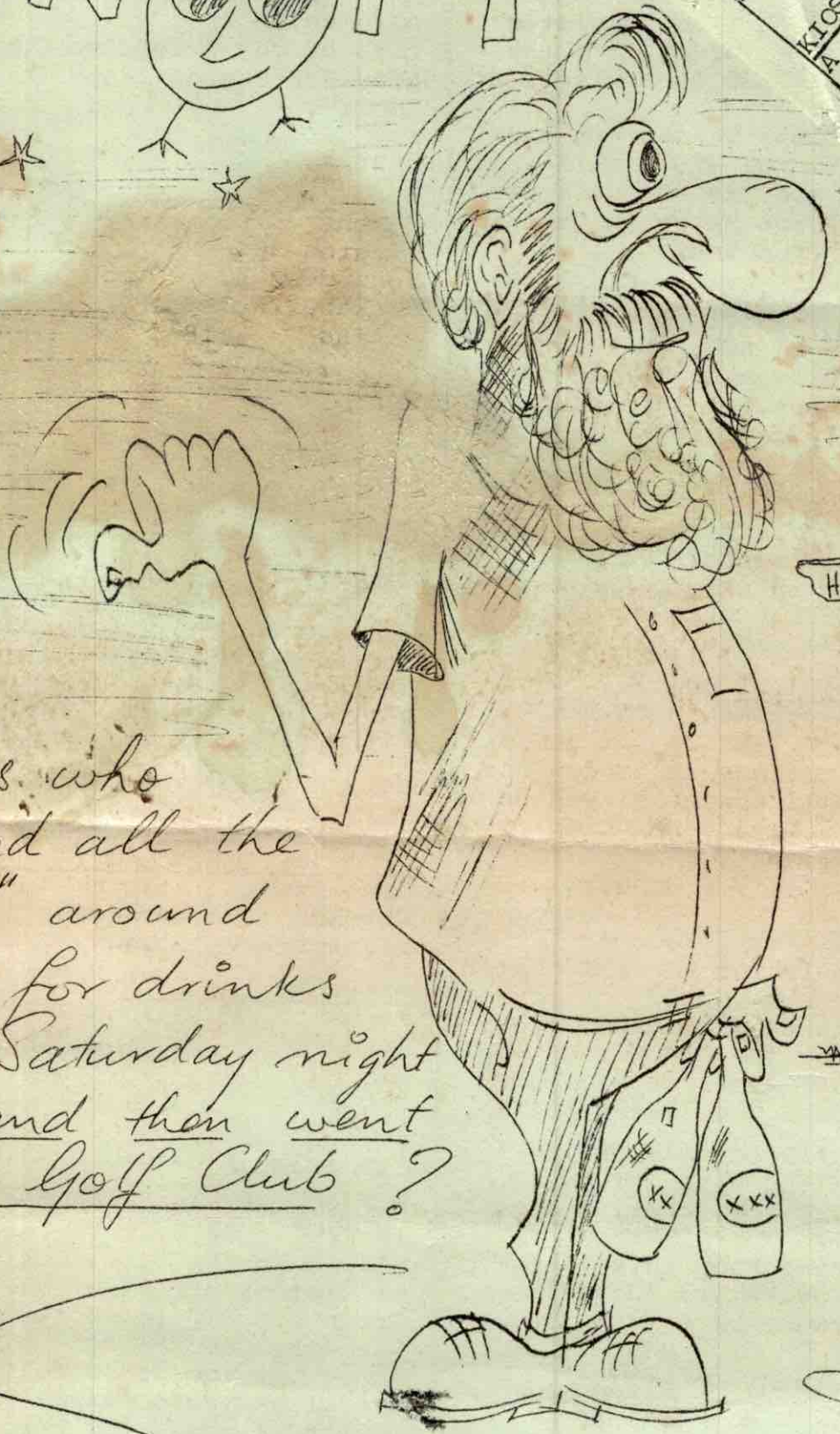
