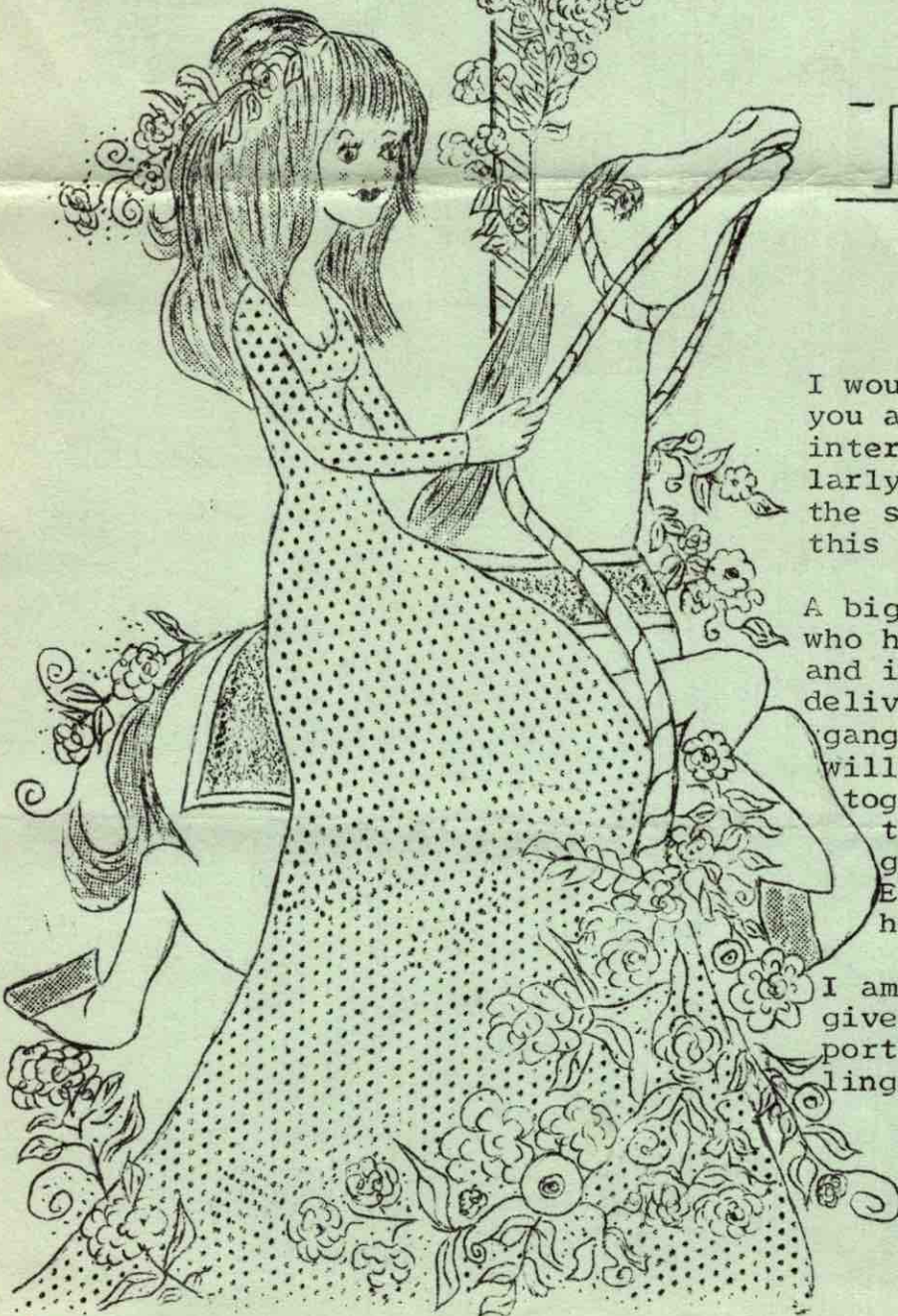

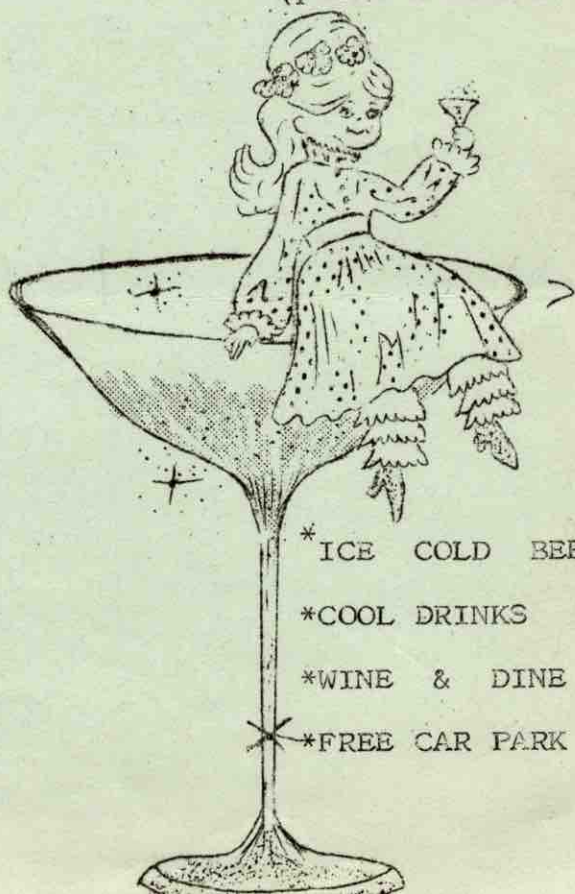

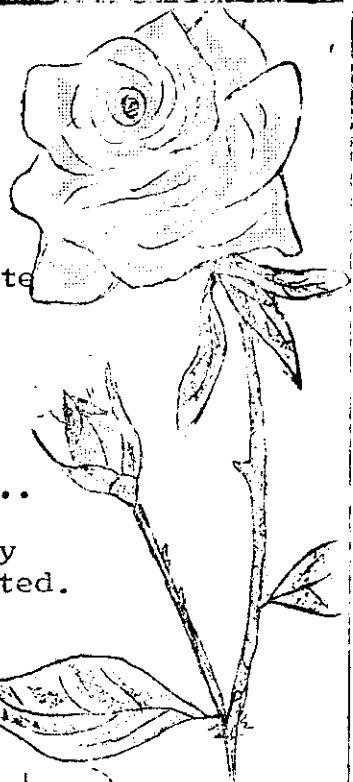

Back to Beltana

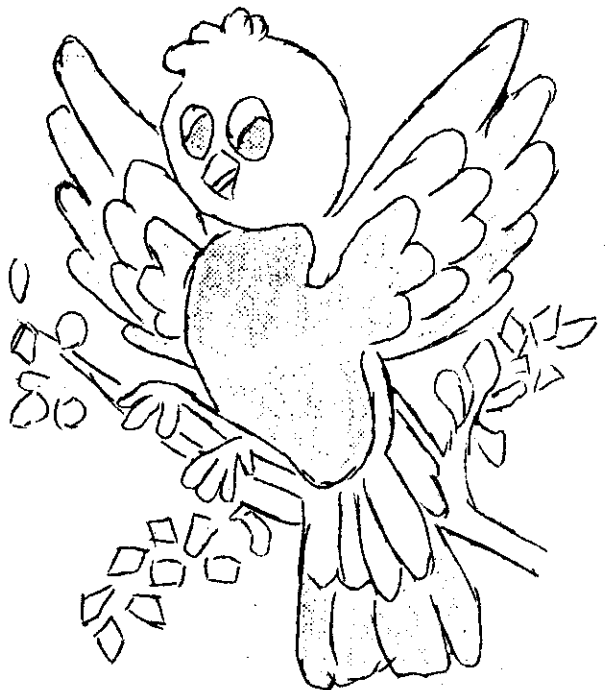

GREEN THUMB

Lawns - will benefit from a dressing of lawn manure now. New lawns can be sown at this time of the year. Low spots in lawns can be filled with sand to level them.

Roses - are at present in their autumn flush of bloom. Cut dead flowers off, but do not prune the bushes till July. New roses should be ordered through the Club NOW.

Fruit Trees & Vines - Deciduous fruit trees are beginning to shed their foliage now. They will not need much water, but remember to give them an occasional good soaking even when dormant. Do not prune them 'till late June or July. Order new fruit trees NOW. Most citrus trees are cropping well this (cont.)
