Residents of Leigh Creek are advised that they can have a free safety check carried out by ETSA on any electrical appliance or extension cord. The check is FREE. If a defect is found the owner will be advised and requested repairs charged for. Items for checking should be given to Mrs P LEPA in the ETSA Administration Block.

Householders should periodically check their house earthing system - this is normally an earth wire clamped to a water pipe outside the house. It must be firmly clamped and free of rust.

Report it to Mrs P Lepa if you suspect something wrong.

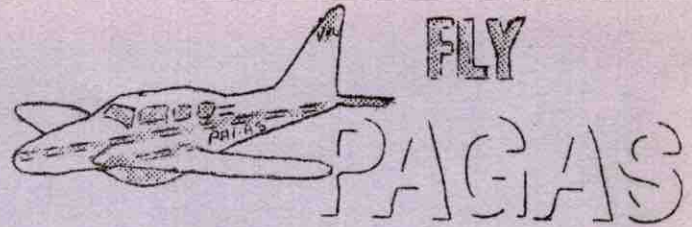

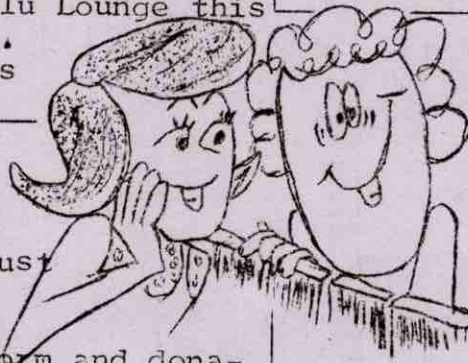
