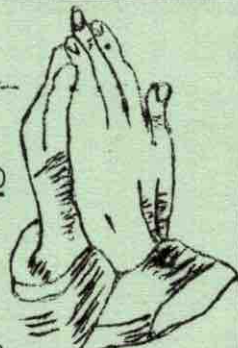
LEIGH CREEK AMATEUR SWIMMING CLUB
