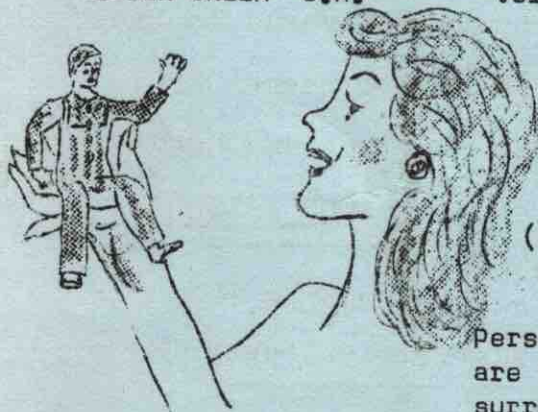

SAFETY SID tell how the little Woman

Helps

keep HER MAN SAFE

(This interesting article was taken from the "Industrial Supervisor" - Sept '74).

Personal safety is reflected in a person's attitude. Attitudes are formed from an individual's environment - the influences that surround him during the course of his everyday life.

The two areas which most contribute to this environment are WORK and HOME, with the edge in most situations going to the HOME as the largest single contributor.

HOME IS WHERE THE HEART IS! Because the family is the basic unit of harmonious human life, the happier the home is, the happier its occupants. When things go well at home, the trials and tribulations at work can be greatly lessened because the person's attitude is positive and receptive. His awareness is keen and his mind uncluttered with worry and concern about personal problems. He is able to devote 100% of his attention and efforts to the efficient and safe performance of his job.

BUT, let disharmony arise at home, and the tables are radically reversed. Perhaps an argument with his wife, trouble for the children at school, mounting financial problems, or some other personal difficulty causes mental distraction, but the end result can too often be far worse than the original problem.

The mind can become momentarily anesthetized by the worries at home, and, because this lapse in paying attention causes him to be oblivious of the job he is doing, an operation which, when given full attention, can be done safely, becomes acrippler - or a KILLER.

No argument, no upset, no disharmony or personal problem is WORTH THE LOSS of the ability to make a living. It is worth neither the risk of injury nor death. Time does not heal all ills! When has time healed the effects to a family of the death or dismemberment of the wage earner?

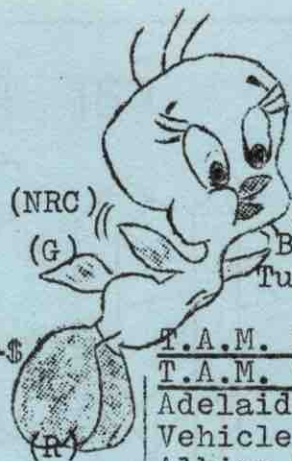
Is it not far better - first soothe the mental wounds of personal problems and minor family feuds than to send a worried individual, hardly conscious of the dangers of his environment, into a safe working area which inattention can turn into a jungle of pit-falls?

The family - and the home - MUST OPERATE as a HARMONIOUS UNIT, protecting each of its members in everyway possible. UNITED IT STANDS and divided it FALLS - and great can be the fall thereof.

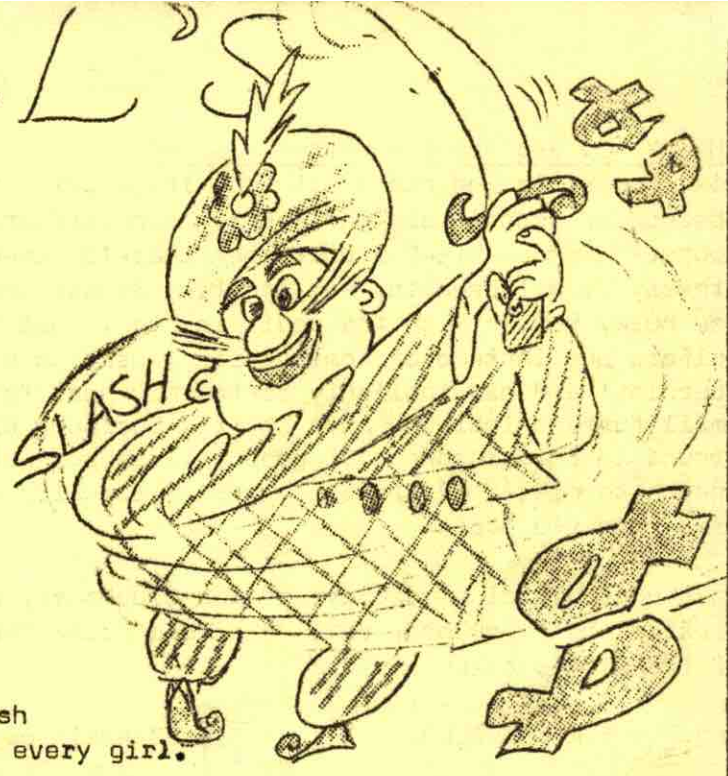

For many years now Leigh Creek and other areas supplied with mains water have enjoyed almost unlimited usage from the Arroona Dam supply.

It should be obvious to all in the area, that the water situation is now becoming CRITICAL, and economies in usage must take place.

While the "good years" were with us, many householders purchased and installed private swimming pools in their back yards - and have thoroughly enjoyed their benefits.

With the current water supply situation, we can ill afford wastage, or luxuries, of any kind, and residents are strongly urged to make full use of the public swimming pool this summer.

Should it become necessary to impose further restrictions on the usage of water, then a total ban on all private swimming pools will be imposed.

It is opportune also to remind the owners of such pools that they should comply with the S.A. Govt. Swimming Pools (Safety) Act, 1972 in relation to fencing and other requirements.

- 4) More school camps with parent participation.
- 5) "How can you help/or become involved?" - Become involved in career talks.
- 6) Use Raywood conference centre at every funded opportunity.
- 7) Have other similar conferences - even one consultant would be a help.
- 8) Greater efforts to promote "face-to-face" parent involvement.

- 9) Students to receive more intensive job experience - lecturing by parents.
- 10) Feed-back, better communication concerning students' progress, socially and educationally.
- 11) Parents to encourage children to overcome weaknesses and assist children in selecting courses.
- 12) Parents must become involved in their childrens' education and show they care so that their children may show progress.

To SUM UP THE CONFERENCE - we really learned that the children whose parents care, are the children who will show progress. Parent involvement has benefits for the parents, children and teachers.

I take this opportunity to thank your Association for the interest and comments in this matter.

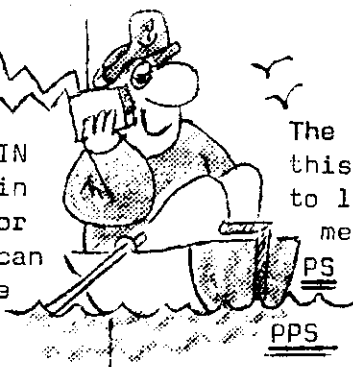

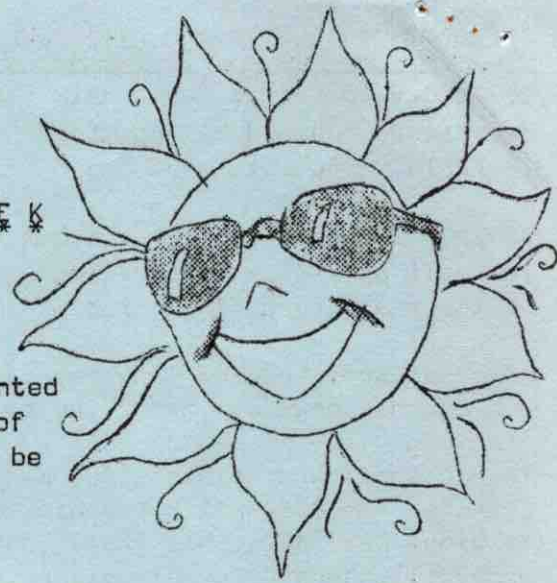

RELOCATION OF LEIGH CREEK



TOWN PLAN

At its last meeting the E T S A Board approved in principle the town plan of New Leigh Creek as presented by the Monarto Development Commission. This means of course that a lot of more detailed planning can now be started.

SOIL FOR THE NEW TOWN

By the time this paper goes to print, F T & B I THOMPSON, earthmoving contractors will have completed the removal of approximately 20 000 m³ of silt from the upper reaches of Arona Dam. This silt will facilitate landscape work on the new town site.

BUFFER ZONE FENCE

The erection of approximately 8 km of rabbit proof fencing around the town site has been started by Spencer Gulf Plant & Hire. This work should be completed early in November.

WATER

The E & W S Dept have started the construction of 3 km of 6" galvanised steel water pipe from the Summit Tank to the Town site. This is a temporary supply line to service the proposed drip irrigation system. The letting of the irrigation contract is imminent.

TRAFFIC

You are reminded of the need to stay on existing tracks when visiting the new town site. This will become even more important when the drip irrigation system is installed and young trees planted.
