Mr Allan Dunn of Lyndhurst, will be running the booth at the races.

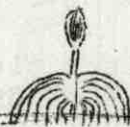
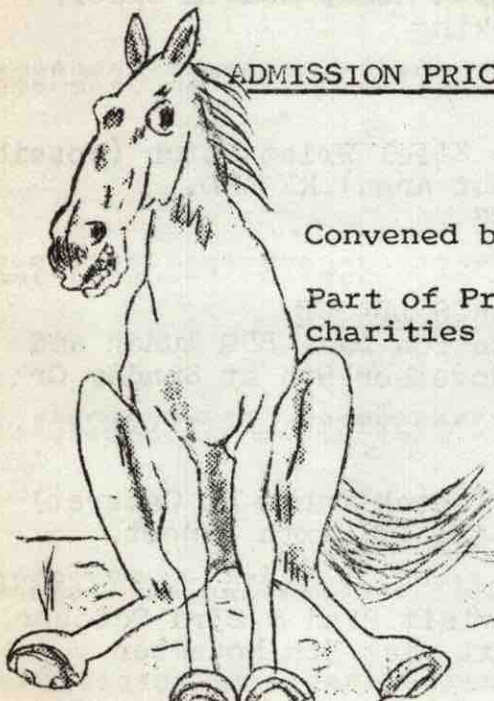

### Green Thumb

Many people have recently noted seedling peach, apricot and nectarine trees under their trees.

Should you wish to grow these trees, it is preferable to have them grafted in their 2nd year or late in their 1st year should they reach pencil thickness.

Grafting is done for two main reasons. Firstly seedling plants may take many years to produce fruit, or may never produce fruit. Secondly when they come into fruit, the fruit may be inferior or may be produced in small amounts.

Since fruit trees take a few years to produce fruit in quantity, it is not advisable to grow seedling trees, though occasionally, seedlings are OK.

Should you have young seedling trees, I will either show you how to graft them, or graft them for you. The grafted tree will produce fruit exactly the same as the tree we take the graft wood from. If you know of a good tree, then select wood from it for grafting purposes.

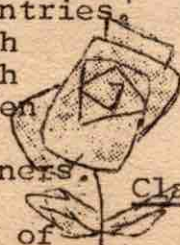

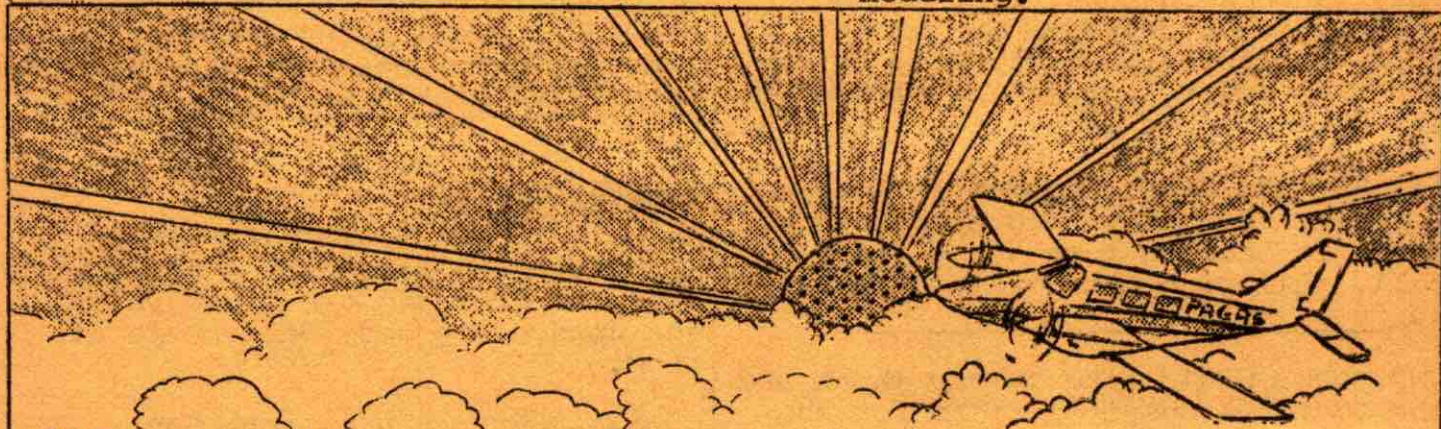

# Bees!

Many people have noticed swarms of bees in their yards in the last few weeks. These bees are in abundance due to the good seasons of the last three years, causing the bees to breed up in the creeks around the town. When the bees fill their hive, which is usually in a hole in a tree, they split their numbers in two, and half leave the old hive with a new queen and fly off to a new area to find a new home.

The queen lands on a tree or fence, and all her subjects land on her to protect her. This mass of bees is called a "swarm". The swarm will then hang while groups of bees scout for a new hollow to move into.

If you notice a number of bees flying around your windows these are scout bees and should be left well alone. They will go away in about a day if they don't find a hole to go into.

The bees in a swarm are very quiet, and will not sting unless disturbed. They will only stay till they find a hole to go to. If a swarm lands in your yard, keep away from it and leave it alone. It will probably go in a day or two. Instruct your children not to throw stones at it.

Should the swarm be in a dangerous place e.g. hanging over a path, then Peter Shooter or Terry Hickey will remove it. Also should a swarm move into a shed or box, Peter & Terry will remove it. Should a hive move into your chimney, light a fire if you have an open fireplace, or hang a 'shelltox' strip in it.



Bees are to be respected, but not feared. Leave them along, and normally they will leave you alone.

If stung, scratch the sting out with your finger nail, DON'T pinch it to pull it out, as the poison sac is on the end and squeezing will only inject the poison. Dress the sting with ammonia or blue bag or anti-histamine cream.

Dear Sir,

I refer to your letter of 28th July, 1975 and regret any inconvenience caused by the delay in replying.

Had I been aware that your Association was anxious to see me personally with regard to those matters raised in your letter, it may have been possible to arrange a meeting during my inspection of roads in the Far Northern district, despite an already tight schedule. However, my District Engineer, Far Northern, is fully aware of the Department's intentions in your area, and is readily available to supply information upon request.

Specific comments with respect to those matters to which you refer are as follows:-

1. Hawker-Marree Road

It is my intention, subject to the continuing availability of finance, and the approval of the Hon. the Minister of Transport, to continue with the construction of this road from Hawker in a northerly direction with the resources of one Departmental gang completing approximately 10-12 km per year.

2. Programme for 1975/76

The amount of funds allocated to your area for the 1975/76 financial year is sufficient to maintain the existing resources of men and equipment for one year. These funds are primarily required to enable maintenance of the existing network of roads maintained by this Department to be carried out as and when required, depending on weather.

During a normal year it has been possible to carry out limited upgrading on a priority basis but due to the exceptionally wet years of 1973 and 1974 little upgrading has been possible.

It can therefore be stated that maintenance funds will be spent on all roads maintained by the Department during 1975/76 but upgrading or new work cannot be predicted.

3. Arkaroola Area

The South Australian Government Tourist Bureau has not requested any roadwork in the Arkaroola area and is unaware of any requests for roadworks within this area.

4. Lyndhurst and Marree Streets - Sealing

Due to the limited availability of finance, it is necessary to consider roadworks strictly on a priority basis having regard to other needs throughout the State. Sealing of the streets of Lyndhurst and Marree does not have a high priority, and it is not possible to say at this stage when such work can be included in the Departmental Construction Programme.
