

Basically the job entails overseeing swimmers and patrons, operating the kiosk, cleaning dressing sheds and toilets and taking admission fees.



Organic gardeners are welcome to help themselves to the cave fertilizer that has been turning up on the cval every few days.

Fresh manure should be stored for a few weeks or dug into ground not required immediately for planting. Alternatively, soak it in liberal quantities of water for 10 days and pour the liquid onto the garden. This is first class fertilizer and is as cheap as a walk to the nval. Make the most of it while it lasts.

All manner of vegetables can now be planted Summer lettuce, carrots, eilver beet, tomatoes, sweet corn, beans and capsicum, to name a few of the more popular.

Peas and sweet peas respond to a side dressing of super phosphate at flowering. Lettuce like some extra nitrogen as they mature to make them green and crisp. This can be supplied with Urea or Sulphate of Ammonia.

Slugs and snails are pests in LC and can be kept down with snail bait.

Citrus trees in LC frequently suffer trace element deficiencies. These show up a yellowing, either all over, or just between the veins. This can be overcome by foliage sprays with very weak solutions of Urea and Trace Elements available from the Garden Club Shed.
