AIRGUNS

COMPULSORY

REGISTRATION

and

RESTRICTED POSSESSION

From 1st January 1972 - ALL AIRGUNS whether with smooth or rifled barrel and irrespective of type or size - will become "firearms" under the firearms act.

Therefore from that date: -

- (1) All airguns must be registered.
- (2) Persons under 15 years must NOT USE, CARRY or HAVE possession of an airgun.
- (3) Persons between 15 & 18 years, or Aliens of any age, must NOT use, CARRY or have POSSESSION of an airgun unless a current firearms licence is held.
- (4) All newly acquired airguns MUST be registered within 14 days.
- (5) Disposal of an airgun, or change of address of the owner, must be notified to the Police within 14 days.

A "Gun Licence" is always required before any type of Firearm is used to SHOOT AT any ANIMAL or BIRD.





will be pumped out and the tiles cleared as the water goes. The job is usually completed in the afternoon but there will be some tidying up and odd jobs to be done on Sunday morning.


