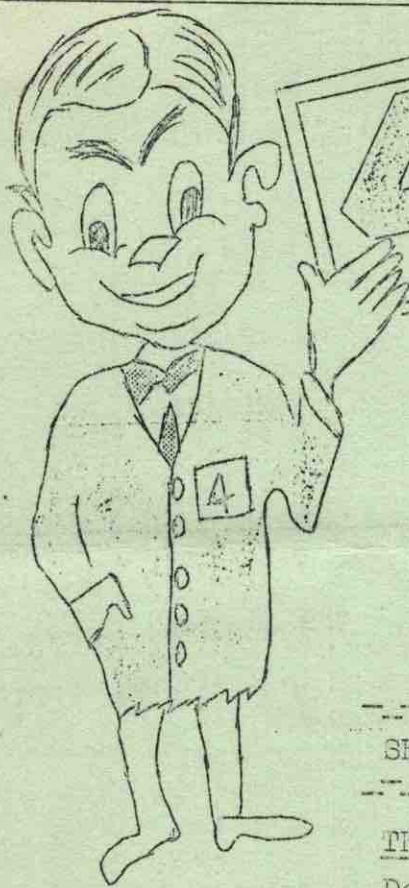

in progress.

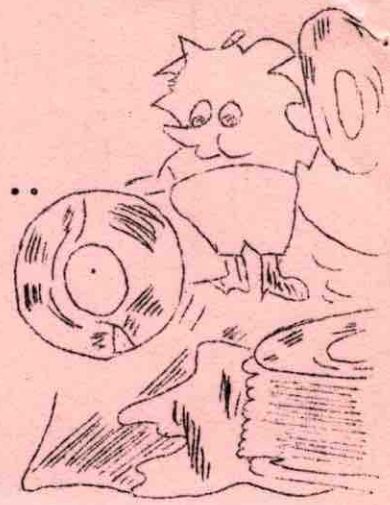
There were nearly 70 players in the first round of the singles and in

Rose Show

Leigh Creek Garden Club.

Please don't forget the Rose Show on Sunday next (17/10/71) in the Community Hall!

Hall opens at 11.00 am to receive exhibits.

The following information may be of assistance to exhibitors.

A copy of the Standards set out by the National Rose Society for judging.

"A GOOD ROSE.

The highest type of bloom is one which has form, size, brightness, substance, and which is, at the time of judging, in the most perfect phase of its possible beauty.

A BAD ROSE.

The following are serious defects in a bloom: Faulty shape, confused or split centres, faded colour and also being under-sized or oversized to the extent of coarseness or overblooming.

FORM shall imply petals abundant and of good substance, regularly and gracefully arranged within a circular outline, and having a well formed centre.

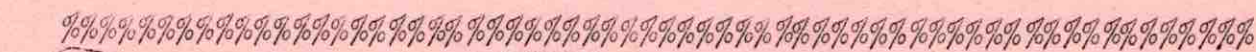
SIZE. shall imply that the bloom is a full-sized representative specimen of the variety.

BRIGHTNESS shall include freshness, brilliance and purity of colour."

A further note on FULL BLOOMS: these shall be judged in the same manner as above exhibition roses, form, freshness, size, purity of colour with a definite showing of stamens or centre being of merit in good blooms.

Good stem and foliage will add value to your exhibit. Faults such as spray residue, pest, or wind damage etc., can detract from it, and here is a hint on cleaning foliage. VINEGAR and a swab of cotton wool will remove most stains.

It will be advisable to take your atomiser, and lightly spray exhibits (with water) before leaving the hall.

Nice to say hullo to MICK WARREN, SUSAN & TERRY BLIESCHKE and to BILL DICKER who have all spent holidays with us recently.



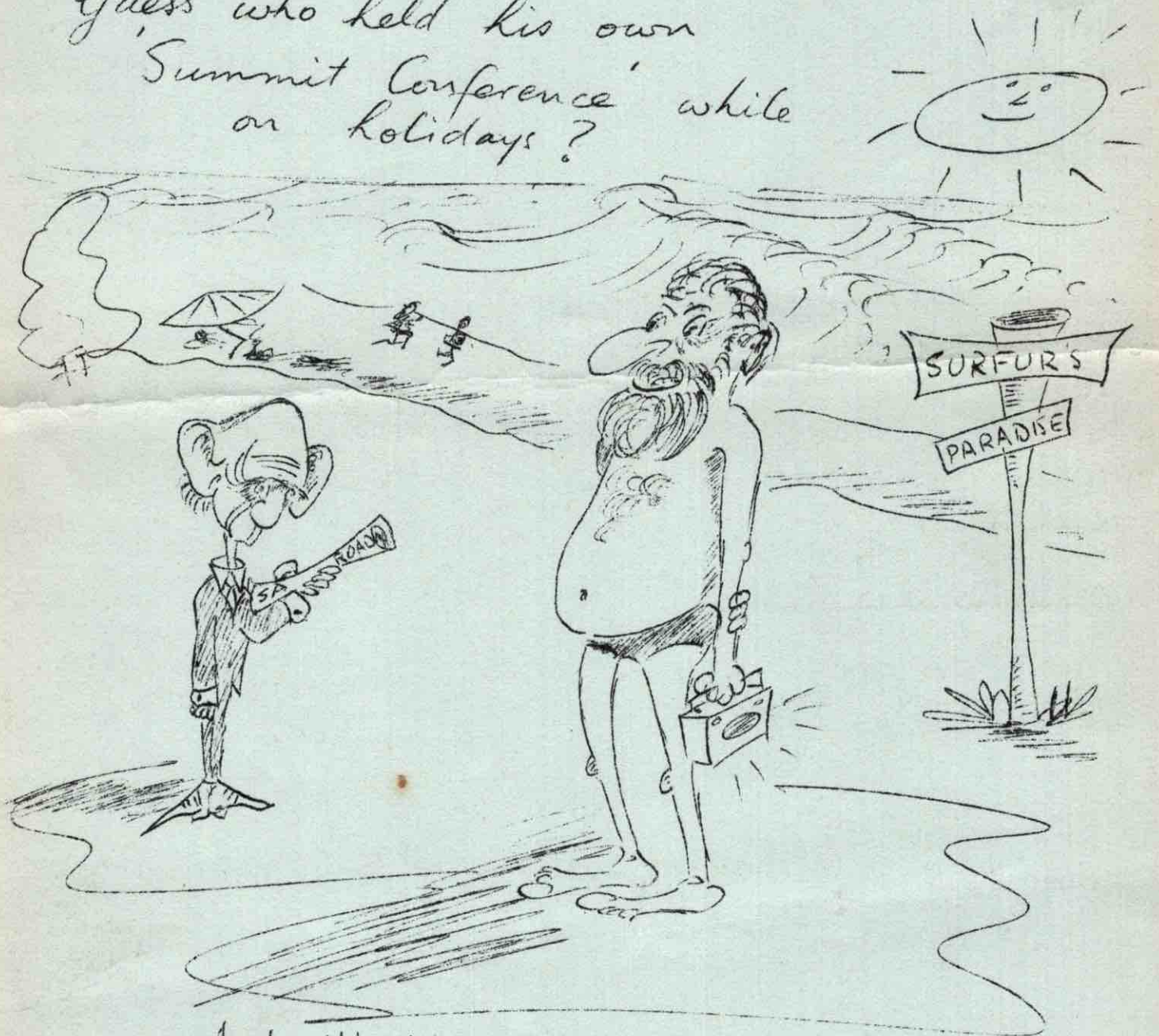
