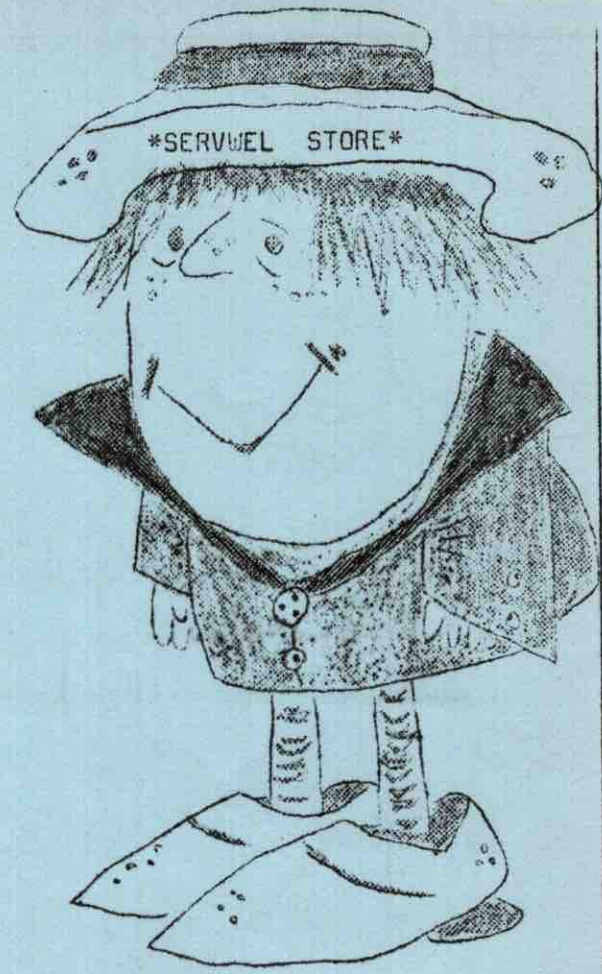

## GLAUCOMA - FREE TESTS

This SATURDAY, 22 October, at the Hospital DENTAL CLINIC from 1.00 - 4.00pm.

ALL ADULTS over the age of 35 years, and also those over the age of 15 years if there is a family history of this disease, are STRONGLY ADVISED to avail themselves of this screening.

WHAT IS GLAUCOMA? - It is a disease, commonest in those over 35 which causes high pressure in the eyeball, slowly destroying the optic nerve, resulting in gradual loss of sight and BLINDNESS if it is not discovered and treated. About 2% of people over 40 have Glaucoma. Most people found to have Glaucoma in the early stages of the disease do not even suspect its presence. The actual screening of the TEST is painless and takes approximately 1 minute only.

This screening is ORGANISED by the PORT AUGUSTA LIONS CLUB who will also endeavour whilst here to explain and discuss the FORMATION of a LIONS CLUB IN LEIGH CREEK. This will be done at a PUBLIC MEETING to be held on SUNDAY, 23 Oct., at 11.am in the COMMUNITY HALL. GREEN THUMB & WATER SAVING  
\*\*\*\*\*

Some of our gardening methods in Leigh Creek are continuations of traditional gardening methods used in higher rainfall regions and not well suited to an arid area.

Water use MUST now be carefully considered and every effort made to save water.

Lawns are the heaviest users of water and especially the softer species. Kikuyu is by far the most drought resistant of all lawn species in Leigh Creek; keep this in mind when planting lawns in the New Leigh Creek.

The aim at this time of water crisis should be to keep our lawns alive. We just cant afford to have them bright and plush as in previous seasons. DECREASE watering lawns to a minimum -- once a month is quite sufficient for Kikuyu.

DRIP IRRIGATION is becoming more and more used in the home gardening situation and must be used more extensively in Leigh Creek in future. It is very efficient in terms of water use and well suited to vegetable gardening and flowers and shrubs. Material may be ordered through the garden Club.

DON'T FORGET to apply mulch. Every week, mobs of lawn clippings go to the dump. This is a terrible waste. Don't be afraid to put them on good and thick as mulch saves water, makes the soil more fertile and stops weeds. Use all your produce. Remember, all the fertilizer you put on the lawn earlier is now in the lawn clippings in organic form. Make use of it.

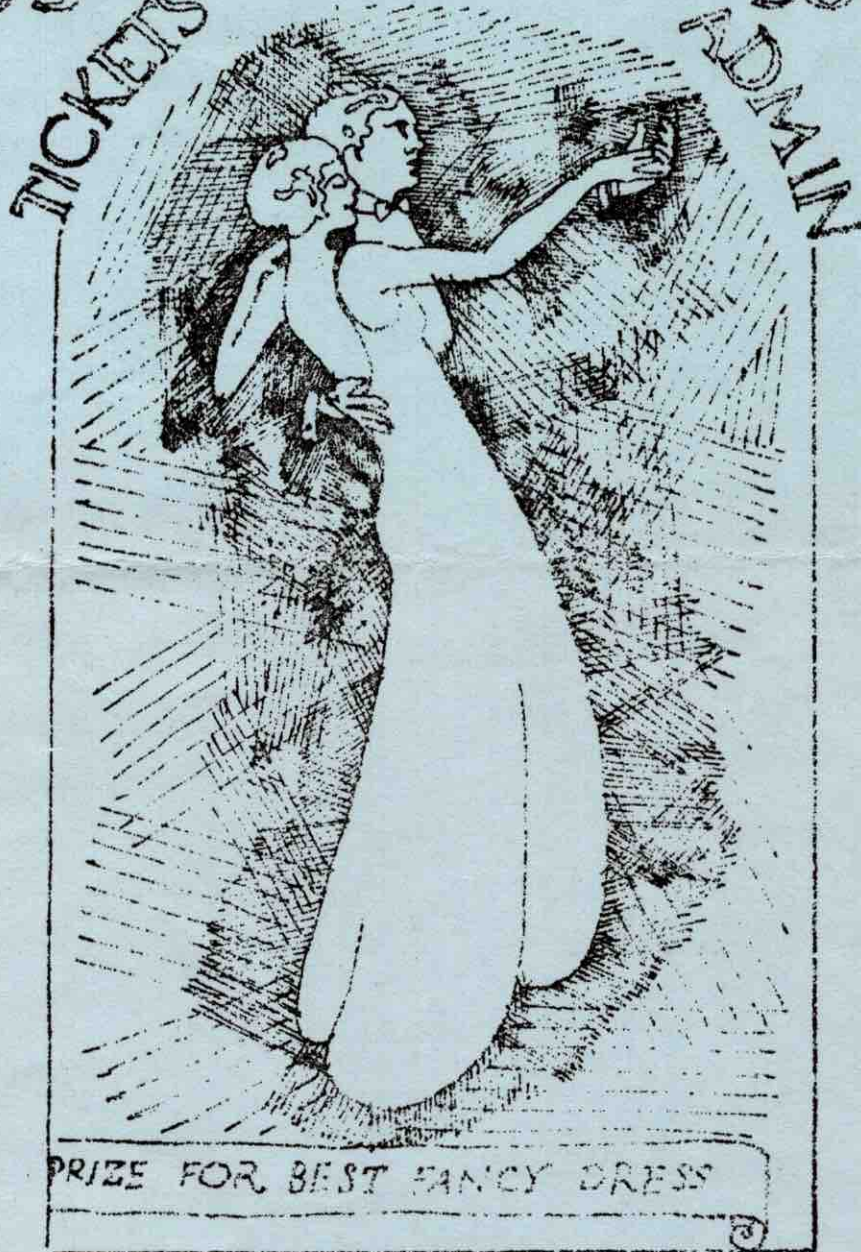
