Matters are complicated by the arrival of Father Schiller; he has been wracked by torture and Reverend Mother agrees to hide him.

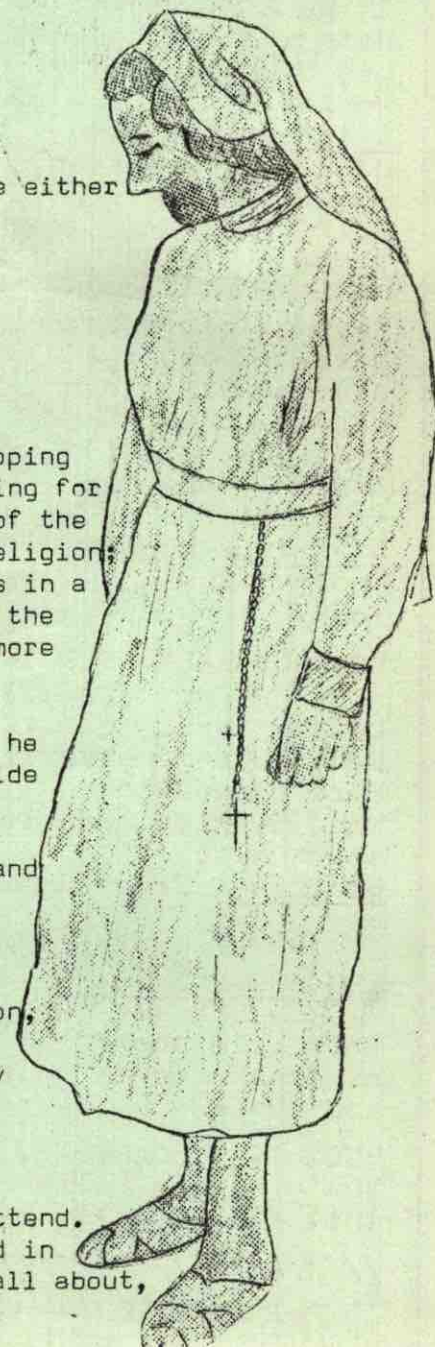
Internal tensions add to the complexities of the situation and cause its dramatic resolution.

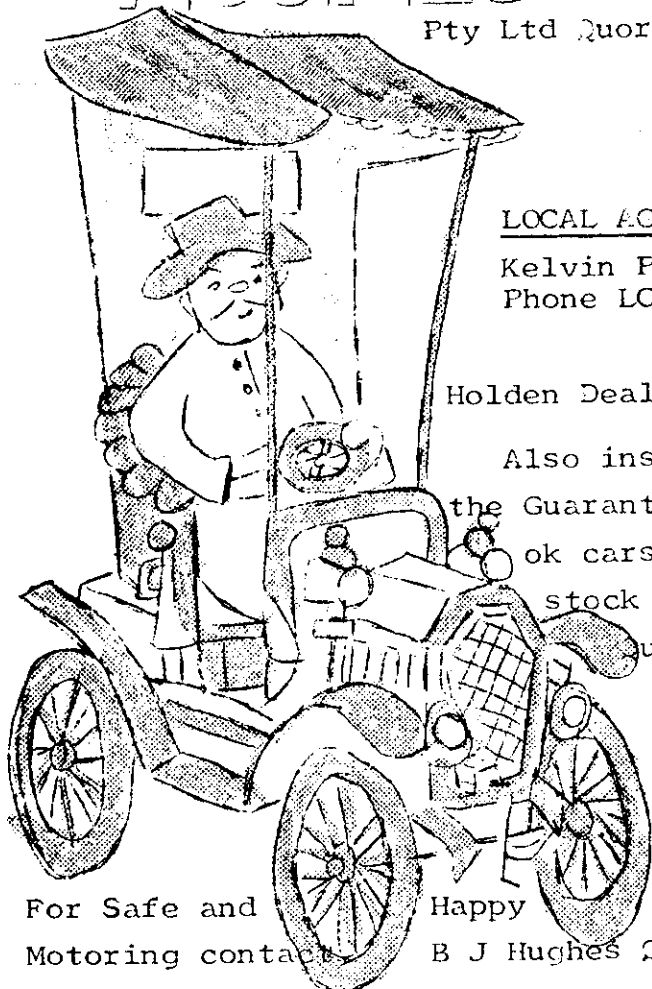
a feature film shown on television across Australia last February, will be shown this MONDAY NIGHT (27th) at 7.30pm in the school library.

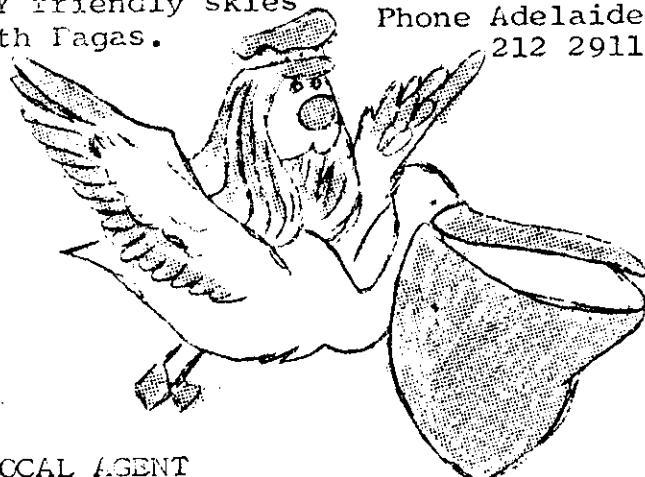

GREEN THUMB - MULCHING

Mulching is the key to easy garden care, Mulching conserves moisture, controls weeds, improves the quality of soil, helps combat salty soils and improves production. The most readily available form of mulch in LC is lawn clippings, which are available in large quantities in summer. Far too frequently people discard their clippings. With it goes all the fertilizer put on the lawn during the spring. This is very wasteful. By using the clippings as mulch your lawn fertilizer is recycled through your garden in healthy organic form.

Mulching is water saving. By keeping the soil surface covered, water does not evaporate so fast and consequently gardens need not be watered as frequently.

This SAVES WATER and saves time. Can also save your plants if you forget to water or go away for a few days in summer. Lawn clippings decompose readily and can be dug in after your vegetables are finished adding reliable organic matter to soils. This is of great value in Leigh Creek where soils are very heavy.

Mulching around trees and shrubs is an excellent idea as well to keep down weeds, and saves water.

After a year of mulching, the worm population in your gardens increases tremendously and worms are the best soil conditioners of all.

Use your lawn cuttings this summer to good advantage and MAKE YOUR GARDEN GO.

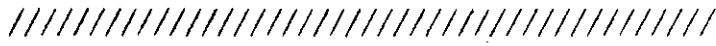

Any arrangement of mixed fresh flowers, foliage and leaves allowed. No accessories. Roses not permitted. Judged from the front.

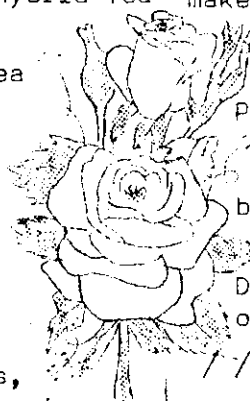
Class IX
