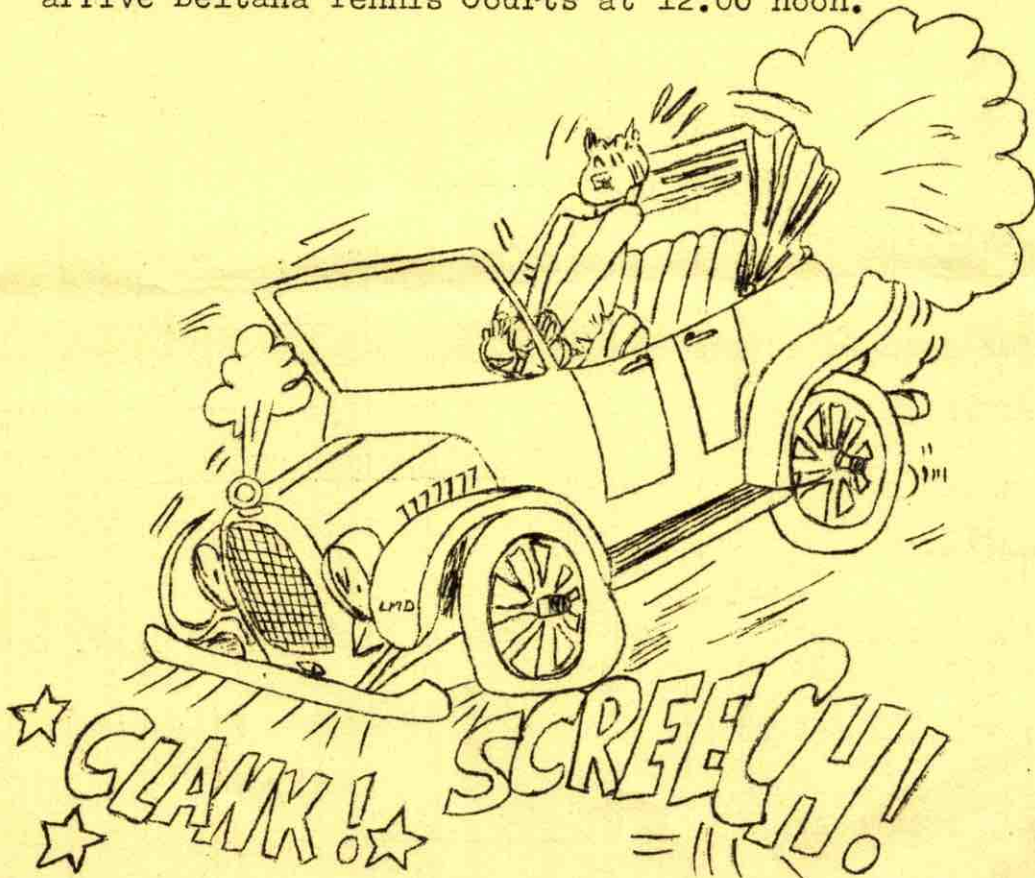

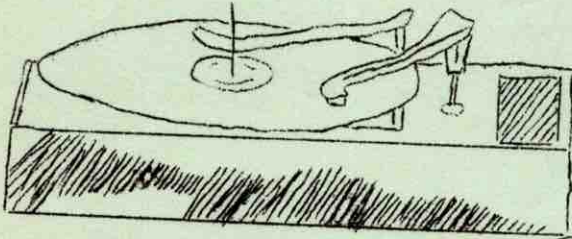

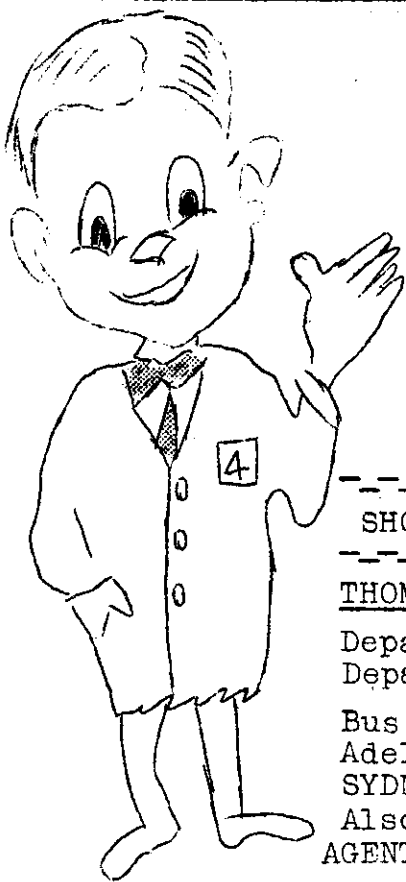

### WHAT IS GLAUCOMA?

Chronic Glaucoma is an eye condition in which increased pressure or tension within the eye gradually destroys sight.

Normally the eye is filled with nourishing fluid which is constantly being formed in the eye and drained off into the blood stream.

When the drainage canals do not work correctly, the fluid can't get out and pressure builds up inside the eyeball. There are usually no early symptoms so people can have Glaucoma for several years without knowing it.

Glaucoma is commonest in those over 40. Surveys of those tested in the past show 20 in 1,000 people over 40 have Glaucoma. Where there is incidence of Glaucoma in the family 10 in 100 have the disease..

Glaucoma is a disease which may be difficult to detect but the tests applied in a mass screening will detect a high percentage of those people suffering Glaucoma.

The Lions Club of Port Augusta will be carrying out a screening in the RSL Hall on Saturday and Sunday the 14 and 15 of October.

There will be further publicity but enquiries can be made at the Admin. Office.

The last screening was 2 years ago and as a result at least one persons sight was saved. How is yours?

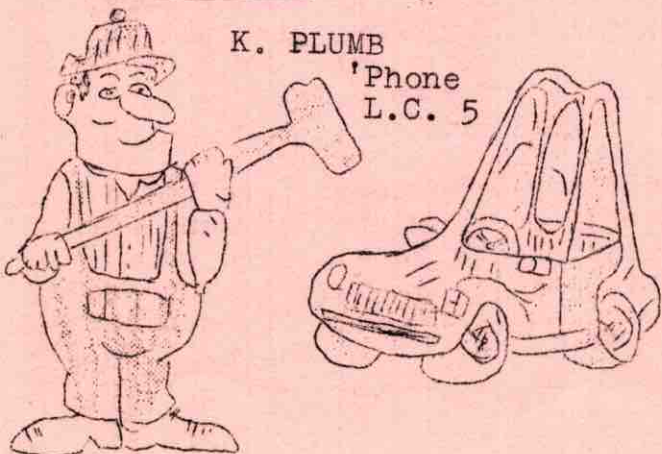
