If you need an ambulance please call at, or telephone the hospital - LC 34. The Sister-in-charge will need information concerning the case (this applies to illness as well as injury). Having obtained this information, she will dispatch the ambulance and make all the necessary arrangements to receive the patient or patients.

It is common practice for people to bundle vehicle accident victims into a car and drive them to hospital. This can be extremely dangerous and the injuries caused by poor handling can be worse than the original ones. Unless you are certain that the patient can be transported safely it would be wiser to leave the transporting of patients to the ambulance crews.
