
# RETIREMENT OF Mrs F RICK

# ARMY EXERCISE - LC to FARINA

1. The 16 Light Anti Aircraft
Regiment of the Royal Aust.
Artillery based at Woodside
Sth Australia will be conducting an exercise in the LC Lyndhurst Area between 16 - 21 Oct 72.

- The exercise will take the form of commando type raids on certain objectives in this area.
- 3. The area will be defended by members of the Unit dressed in normal Army Green Uniforms, patrolling the area on foot and in landrovers. The attacking forces will be on foot and dressed in a mixture of Army Green Uniforms and Black Uniforms.
- 4. All participants in the exercise will be carrying rifles and armed with blank ammunition. They will also be using hand grenade simulators similar to large fire crackers.
- 5. The Officer Commanding the Defending Forces would appreciate participation of the residents of the area by reporting any soldiers seen, dressed in black uniforms, to the Leigh Creek Police Station, where an Army Reporting Centre will be established.


