TWO MIGRANTS AT THE FOOTBALL

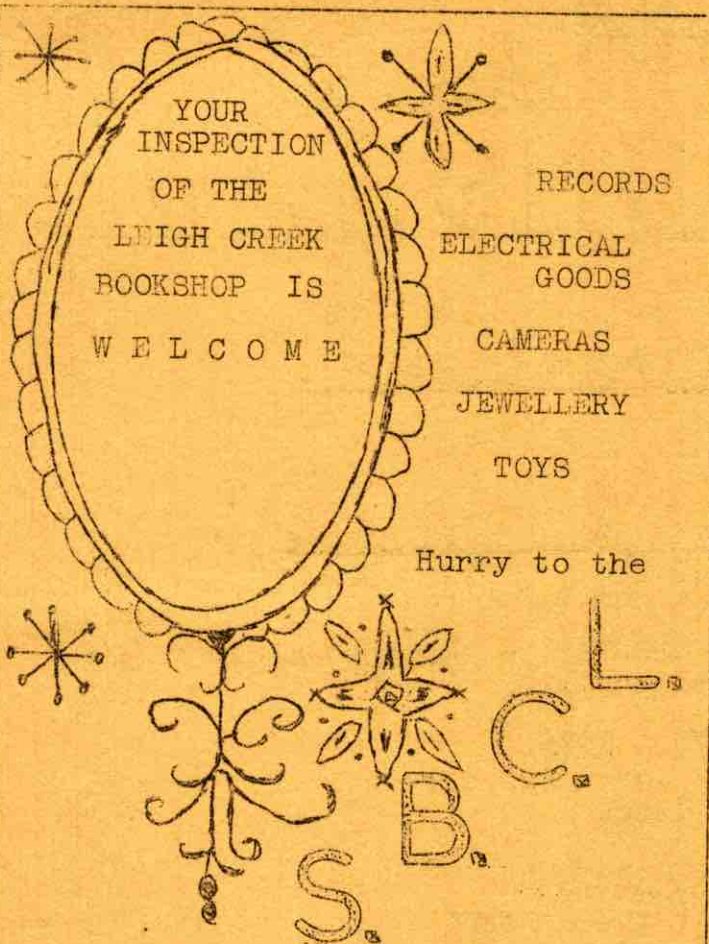
"Now that Guiseppe and me is naturized, we think maybe we go see a foot-ball match.
