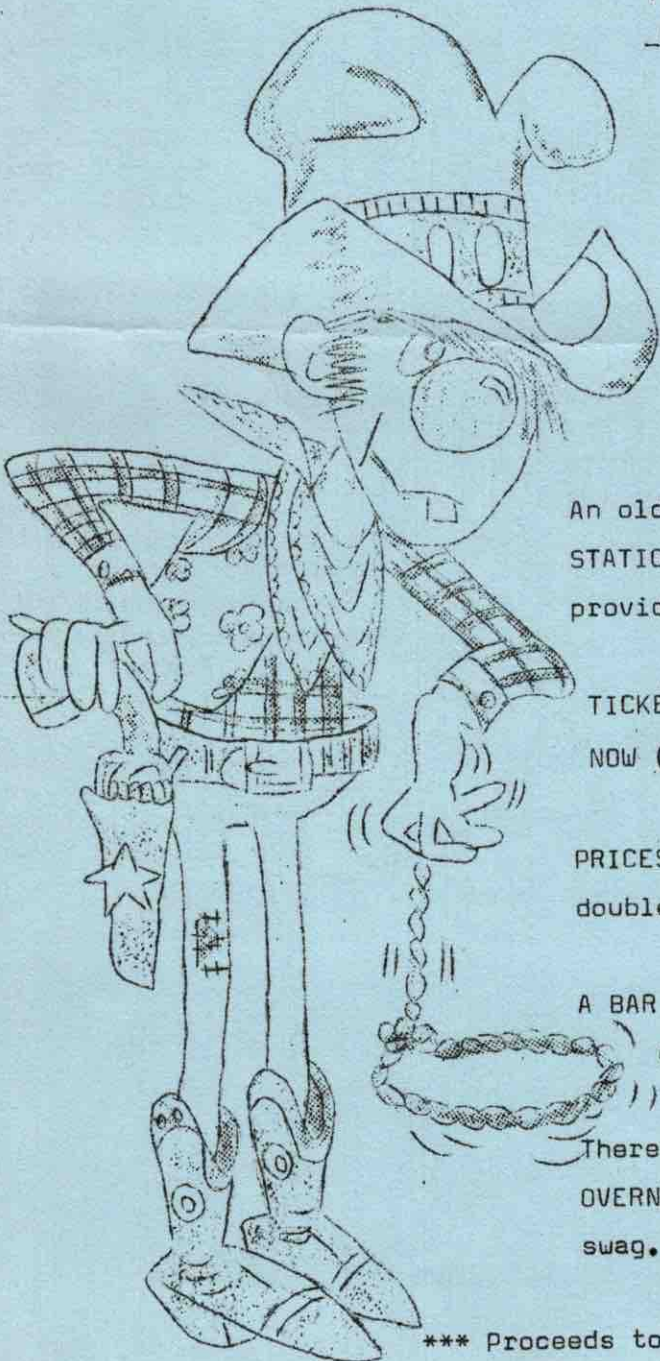
TICKETS are available at the Administration Office NOW (either Mrs BEV SCOTT or Miss DOROTHY HATCH).

ANTI LITTER LEGISLATION

Under a new Act of Parliament, legislation has been introduced concerning litter in streets and public places.
