"BETTER GARDENS FOR LEIGH CREEK"

The following comments on the recent garden competition were made by the Director of the Botanic Gardens, Mr N. LOTHIAN and are published in the interest of "better gardens for Leigh Creek".

POINT TO WATCH :- A number of competitors' lost points because they did not have examples for each of the sections on which the gardens were judged. In both Restricted 'A' and 'B' points were lost because of the lack of vegetables and in one or two gardens because there was either no fruit trees and vines or merely one or two.

It is pleasing to see that many of the newer entries are increasing the numbers of trees and shrubs in their gardens. However, to enable these to make rapid growth, it is essential that the lawns be kept away from the young plants for at least two years.

Attention is again drawn to the necessity of having at least two or three trees in the vicinity of the outdoor living area. Whilst this area is more likely to be used in the evening, there will undoubtedly be occasions when it is used during the day, but this will not be possible unless shade from trees is present.

Although many owners have incorporated a number of vines to form a shady area, some of these have been placed in positions where they will be of little use. Vines for this purpose are particularly valuable if planted and trained on trellises on the northern and western side of the house.

Some gardens still have unnecessary areas of gravel and have used rocks for edging which are out of proportion to the size of the beds. Also it must be remembered that where rock edging is used, greater care must be taken to ensure that weeds are not left. Many of the vegetable gardens had obviously been recommenced at a fairly late date. It is also noted that there is a tendency ~~once~~ more for some home gardeners to have individual raised beds. This treatment not only requires more maintenance but very much more water because of the rapid evaporation from the extra surfaces.

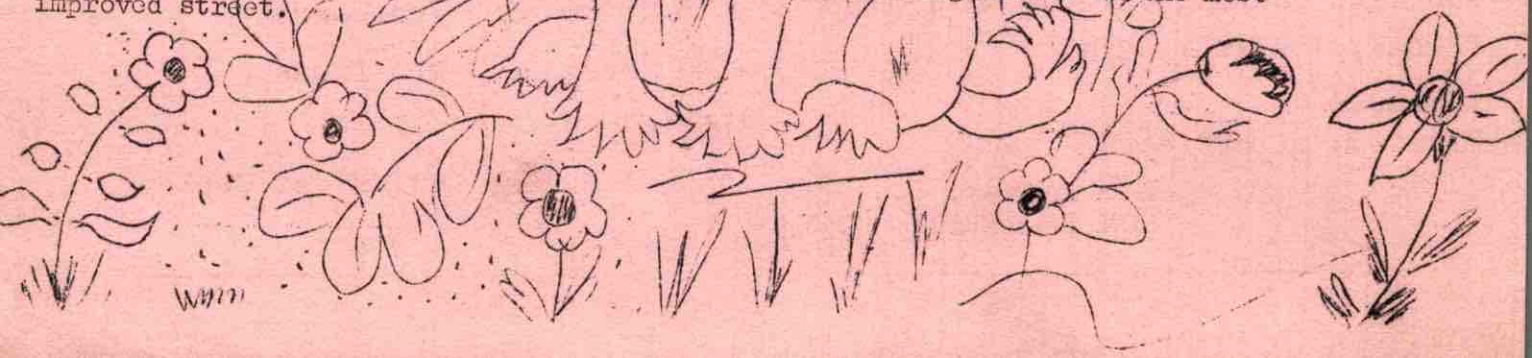
COMMENTS ON COMPETITION GARDENS

The standard in both the Suburban and Country Type gardens was improved over last year. Competition was very strong and many gardeners missed out on prizes merely because of a few points.

It was pleasing to see continued good entries in both Restricted 'A' and Restricted 'B'. This means that those in the Suburban and Country type gardens will have many challenging competitors next year.

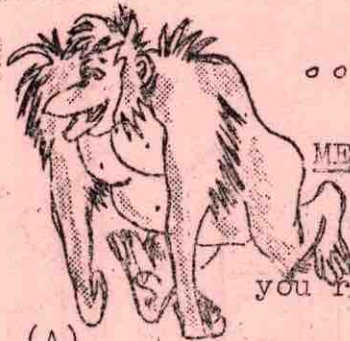

These competitors should remember that although they may not receive a prize this year, their garden could be top rating next year and also they would be eligible to enter the most improved section.

The problem of selecting the best street was not an easy one to solve, however, this has been awarded to Fourth Street with South Terrace being listed as the most improved street.

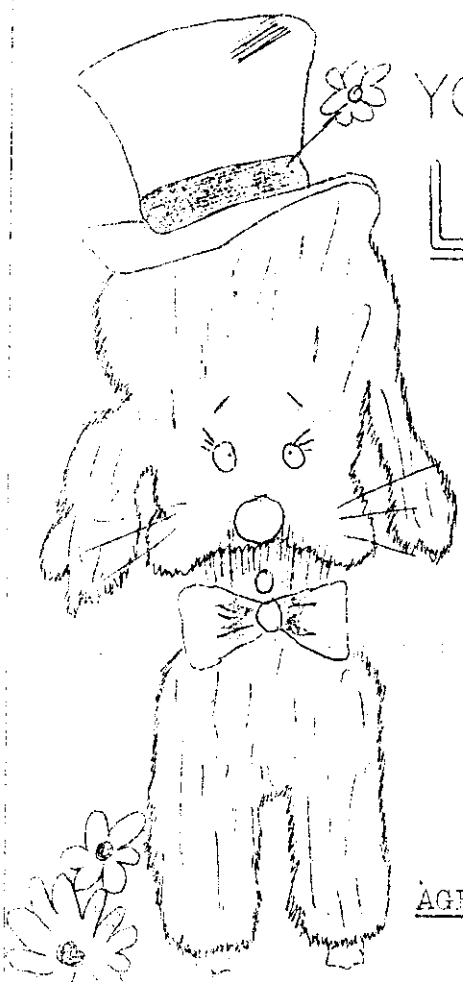

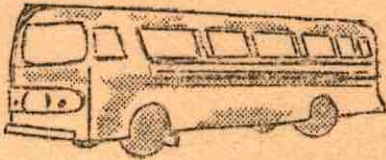
