


Mrs CHEREE MORONEY is presently in the Queen Victoria - hopefully, news is expected late today.

LEIGH CREEK PRE-SCHOOL KINDERGARTEN (NOTICE OF INTENTION TO BECOME A BRANCH KINDERGARTEN)

At a recent meeting of the LC Pre-school Kindergarten Committee, it was decided to apply to the Kindergarten Union of Sth Australia for Branch Status.

Since the beginning of the first term of 1977, the Leigh Creek Kindergarten has been an Affiliate Kindy of the Kindergarten Union. This association with the KU has meant that the teaching staff are now finally being paid a salary commensurate with their duties. Additional financial grants have also been made to assist the committee with the payment of insurance, paint supplies, and cleaning costs etc. As an affiliate the committee has autonomy in -

- (1) Operating the Kindergarten -
- (2) Appointing Staff -
- (3) Handling finances and providing equipment.

However, the affiliation with the KU has also brought with it a significant increase in the work load on the committee and in the complexity of the finances handled by the Treasurer. The bulk of this work load and book-keeping would be removed if the Kindergarten were to become a Branch.

As a Branch Kindergarten, the KU would administer the Kindergarten, assuming the responsible lity for staffing wages, insurances, other (cont..

operating costs and for the basic equipment and the building. This would then allow the committee to devote more of its time to fund raising and working bees, to improve, add to and maintain the equipment and grounds of the Kindergarten, and to organise and finance other Kindergarten activities.

For the above reasons, and others, the commit tee feels that for the sake of the kiddies at tending the Kindergarten now and in the future, there are definite advantages in becoming a Branch Kindergarten.







The Golden Rule - Whoever has the gold makes the rules.


Wilkerson's Law - The anotomy of any group includes 4 kinds of bones:-
