COUNTILY METERRE CORNEI

On 15 September 1977, State Government Regulations came into effect with regards to BABY SITTING AGENCIES.

These Regulations state, that under the Community Welfare Act, any person who conducts a Baby Sitting Agency, must be licenced for the purpose.

A Baby Sitting Agency is defined in the Community Welfare Act as:-

"Any person or body of persons that:

(a) carries on a business in the course of which persons are employed for the purpose of caring for children in their homes in the temporary absence of their parents or guardians;

OR

(b) carries on the business of introducing to the parents or guardians of children, persons who are prepared to care for the children in their own homes in the temporary absence of their parents or guardian."

The intention of the Legislation is to ensure that Commercial Baby Sitting Agencies and the Baby Sitters they employ give a high level of care and are old and mature enough to take responsibility for young children in the absence of the parents.

However, non commercial arrangements or neighbourly baby sitting arrangements, whereby people caring for children are personally known to their parents, will not be affected and need not be licenced. Thus generally, there is no need for people caring for children in Leigh Creek or surrounds to be licenced, unless they intend to make it a commercial proposition. Payment for services in such cases will still be acceptable, for instance, where a girl undertakes to look after the children of a neighbour and receives payment in return for that service is acceptable without her being licenced.

This does not mean that parents should not take care in choosing the right person with whom to leave their children in their absence. To leave a 12 or even 13 year old boy or girl in charge of young children at home is often irresponsible on behalf of the parents and grossly unfair both to the baby sitter and to the children in his or her care.

The Act states that no person under 18 should be licenced to be a baby sitter. While often, this may not be practicable in Leigh Creek, it does show that baby sitting is considered to be a highly responsible job, which should not be lightly dropped on a child. (cont..

A leaflet giving information and advice for parents and baby sitters is in the process of being prepared and should be available from the Community Welfare Office, Leigh Creek, shortly.

FAR NTHN DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION

The following letter was recently received by the Association and is printed for your interest.

"Dear Mr Barber.

Following representations I made on your behalf to the Minister for National Resources, Rt.Hon. J D Anthony, MP, concerning the former country freight subsidy scheme on petroleum products, I have now received a reply.

A copy of the Minister's letter is enclosed for your information. It is noted in the final paragraph of the Minister's letter, that this matter is currently being reviewed.

"Parliament House, Canberra A.C.T.

Dear Senator Jessop,

Mr Anthony has asked me to reply to your letter of 5 Sept 1977 in which you sought advice in order to reply to Mr R Barber, Secretary of the Far Northern Development Association, who wrote to you about the former country freight subsidy scheme on petroleum products.

The country freight subsidy scheme that operated until August 1974 covered motor gasoline, power kerosene, automotive distillate, aviation gasoline and aviation turbine fuel, and held the wholesale price of these products to no more than 5 cents per gallon (it had originally been 3.3 cents per gallon) above the wholesale price in the capital cities in each State.

The Government is very mindful of the burden of transport costs borne by country dwellers, particularly those in outlying districts, and did in fact consider the reintroduction of a price equalisation scheme when preparing the recent Budget.

Because of the current stringent economic circumstances the proposals, like many others had to be rejected, but this matter is currently being reviewed.

* * * * * * * * * * * * * * AIR-COOLERS

The combination of the low water level at Aroona Dam and the introduction of Sliding Rock water, has meant that the salinity level (dissolved salts) in the town supply has almost doubled to what it was 12 months ago.

The evaporative coolers in the town are being affected by this higher salinity level if they are not being drained and cleaned regularly. The "Aquacool" units (revolving drum type) MUST be drained and flushed out AT LEAST TWICE PER WEEK - more frequently if possible - to ensure the pad does not clog up with salts. The "Bonaire" type (fixed side pads) bleedoff tube should drip water at a rate of 2 litres/hour to effectively reduce salinity in the water tank - and the tank should be drained and flushed once fortnightly.

These simple measures will ensure that the coolers work at their best - and that YOU receive the maximum benefit from them.




