

Karen and the bridesmaids hair styles of sweet bouncing curls were very apt for the overall picture of feminity.




REFORT ON GARDEN COMPETITION - 1974

Selecting the best street was a particularly difficult task as all streets appeared to have several very poor gardens, where no maintenance was carried out. It is a pity these people couldn't be compelled to improve their surroundings.

Whilst there are a number of good examples of European-style gardening, it seems a shame that no-one is motivated to produce a garden of Australian plants. There are many types of Australian shrubs and groundcovers which could be tried in the area.

It would, I am sure, be advantageous to make prize-winning gardens open for public inspection. It seems a pity that the pleasure gained from these gardens is confined to the owners and the judge. Open inspection would also allow other residents to see the standards which can be achieved in culture and maintenance.

All prize winners are to be congratulated for the high standards attained. Those who didn't win prizes need to try a little harder next time and those who didn't enter, should make a firm commitment to enter next year and start planning towards that end.


