Now is an excellent time for planting all container grown trees & shrubs, particularly the tropical & sub-tropical ones which establish best in warm weather, in dry weather they need regular watering. Trees such as Jacarandas, Erythrinas (Coral trees), citrus fruits & many shrubs e.g., Hibiscus, Fiddlewoods, Poinsettia and most others including many of our native shrubs can all be planted now. Then planting do not use fertiliser. It is best to wait for a month or 2 before applying fertilisers as they tend to burn newly planted plants. The best to use are the complete fertilisers, e.g. blood & bone, gro-well or complete liquid fertilisers e.g. aquasol or thrive. If planting in a lwan, keep the grass clear of the tree or shrub for the first 2 yrs until it is well established. A small amount - say a handful of fertiliser each month in warm weather & well watered in, promotes rapid healthy growth.


Lawns need regular cutting now and would benefit from 2 or 3 light applications of fertiliser through the summer to keep them green & healthy. Always water well after feeding. If lawn cuttings are free of seed, they make excellent mulch which saves water, smothers weeds & improves the soil as it rots down.

All fruit trees, particularly citrus, appreciate regular feeding & efforts will be rewarded by higher yields. Suitable fertilisers are blood & bone, superphosphate & sulphate of ammonia or complete mineral mix or mixtures of these. It is best to give several small applications rather than one large one. For an established tree, 1 lb every 6 or 8 weeks would be most beneficial.

Roses should have all dead flowers removed & other shrubs can be cut back or triamed if necessary. (After flowering is the best time for most shrubs). Many large straggly Oleanders would be best cut off near the ground to encourage young vigorous growth which rapidly forms a bushy shrub. Hibiscus can be pruned now especially if spindly. This helps thicken them up & they flower better.







Parents of children already attending in A.M. will be notified personally if he or she is to transfer to the afternoon group.


