



NEM FEICH CBEER

PEST PROOF FENCE - Spencer Gulf Plant & Hire have completed the erection of approx 8 km of pest proof fencing around the new town site. All grazing stock have been removed from within the area and all rabbits eliminated.

If you visit the town site please ensure that you SHUT the GATE after you.

TREES - Nearly 4000 trees have been planted in the buffer zone between the residential area and the main North-South highway.

Preparations are now being made to plant approx 900 more along the Northern perimeter of the township. The trees are planted on a drip irrigation system which controls and limits to a minimum the quantity of water applied.

Because of the young trees now planted in the area it is important that visitors to the site keep their vehicles ON ESTABLISHED TRACKS.

HOUSING, TOWN CENTRE, CIVIL WORKS

The Monarto Development Commission has all but completed the housing specification. However, it will not be put up for tender until a clear


policy for development of the new town is established by the State Planning Authority. In terms of the whole project this should not affect the time schedule as this time will be used to push along the detailed planning and design work of the Town Centre and civil works (water reticulation, sewage disposal, deep drainage etc).

WATER USE AT NEW LEIGH CREEK - The MDC was requested to look at various aspects of current and future water use at Leigh Creek and New Leigh Creek to ensure that any necessary servicing requirements could be incorporated in the initial design of the township. Their report has been received in draft form and their final report should be received very soon.

LANDSCAPE

Landscape guidelines for the new town have been received from the MDC. This report outlines the type of landscaping which should be used for parks, town centre, streets and private homes in the new environment. Aspects of landscape development relate to all other aspects of the development and need therefore to be considered at the detail design stage of the town centre and civil works.






