





Holiday times in the middle of summer poses problems in this climate regards keeping plants alive. It is advisable to give LAWNS a good heavy watering closest to your last day in town. This will carry any established lawn through the holiday period.

If, however, you have recently established a lawn from seed, try to arrange for a mid holiday watering to be done by a neighbour. A couple of bad days can lead to the death of young lawns and the waste of many days of hard work.

POT PLANTS, especially soft types, should be well soaked by placing them in a tub of water, the level in the tub being the same as the soil level in the pot. Leave them for a couple of hours and then place in a selected

shady and protected spot.

VEGETABLES and SHRUBS will need a good heavy watering prior to departure and heavy mulching will be of great value, serving to keep the soil damp. Lawn clippings are excellent for this purpose. It is best to dry the clippings thoroughly first, then apply. This is especially so if your lawn has couch in it.

Fresh clippings tend to pack and may keep the water out, so a weeks drying is advised before use.

TREE OF THE WEEK

By far the most important trees in

Leigh Creek belong to the group

Eucalyptus. These are Australian

trees and are remarkably well suited

to various conditions. Most of the

better ones for this area come from

the Gold Fields and Wheat Belt of

south west Western Australia. Two

of these are coming into flower now.

#### 1) Eucalyptus Pterocarpa

This is a little known Eucalypt from Norseman. It is just starting to become popular. A good specimen is to be seen in the Youth Hall end of the Childrens Flayground.


It has bright green leaves and strange deeply corrigated bud-caps and gum nuts. It is now in full bloom with white flowers.

#### 2) Eucalyptus Stricklandi

This lemon flowered gum is well represented in town. A good one is in front of St Lukes Church on the footpath. In the next couple of weeks it should be in full bloom. Have a look on the way to the shop. There are several in town that are in full bloom so keep your eyes open.


