Please note that Bingo will be held on MONDAY, 9th December instead of Tuesday 10th due to the unavailability of the lounge on the Tuesday.

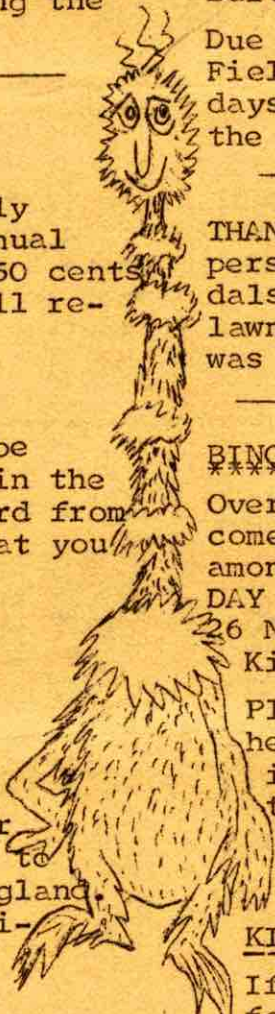
KINDERGARTEN
