Boys 10 yrs & Under - 33 1/3 m - Freestyle - Scratch 3rd WAYNE BURZACOTT


The Club swimmers and officials would like to thank 'Brother' Ron Craven for a safe journey to and from Peterborough.





#### H O W TO GET THE BEST FROM YOUR AIRCOOLER

Due to the prolonged period of hot weather and continual running of air coolers, it is most important that extra care be taken to ensure their efficient operation.

Daily draining of the water from the tank will prevent the build up of salts which tend to clog the pads and decrease the airflow.

Regular attention to cleaning will also assist in keeping the coolers operational.

Two or three times per week, flush the build up of sediment from the bottom of the tank and thus ensure the freedom of movement of the drums rotation.

Lack of attention to these details result in rapid deterioration of efficiency and increases the need for maintenance.

For the comfort of your family during the Summer months we strongly urge you to pay regular attention to your cooler — a few minutes each day will keep your home very comfortable.

Suddenly a strong cleaning up brigade emerge on the scene, namely, the kids of this town, therefore the Minister's aim is still success ful.


As a result we now have cleaner streets, parks, ovals and many other public places, and the keen little band of "Beavers" receive their reward by cashing in on their cans.


