Green Thumb Preports on ...

"THE SAUCY TOWATO"

Tomatoes are probably the most commonly grown vegetable in Leigh Creek, yet it is only this century they have become popular as a fruit. Until recently, the tomato or 'love apple' was considered poisonous, yet they have been the staple diet of Mexican Indians since prehistoric times. For years British gardeners grew them as ornamentals for their bright red berries.

For a long time it was supposed that tomatoes would injure the liver. People were reported to suffer nausea after eating them, though one wonders whether this was due to some factor the tomato no long possesses as a result of mass suggestion. What ever it was, no one dreams of tomato nausea now.

The cultivated tomato probably originated in Peru on the slopes of the Andes, spreading later to Central America and Mexico where it was called "tomati".


It was introduced to Italian gardens early in the 16th Century and later to Britain. The fruit at this stage were very small - about the size of currents Many years of breeding by man, has resulted in the large tomato as we know it now.

Because of a belief that people became temporarily madly passionate after eating tomatoes, the French called them "pomme d' amour", hence the English name - "love apple".

Tomatoes belong to the same group of plants as potatoes, gooseberries and tobacco. These are all tropical plants and thus will not tollerate frost. However, they originate in high humid areas, and thus require some looking after in order to grow them successfully in the dry atmosphere of Leigh Creek.

Most of the commercial tomatoes as we know them have been developed to grow with support. Left unsupported the heavy crown will cause the plant to fall over, resulting in burning of the leaves and fruit by the sun. Support by means of a small cord fence or by tying onto a stake overcomes this problem.

Tomatoes are quite heavy feeders and like a well prepared soil. A couple of handfulls of complete fertilizer per square yard a week before planting, and another light side dressing at first flowering will provide sufficient food for prolonged fruiting. The organic gardener will know tomatoes thrive on well rotted manure of any kind, which is highly recommended.
