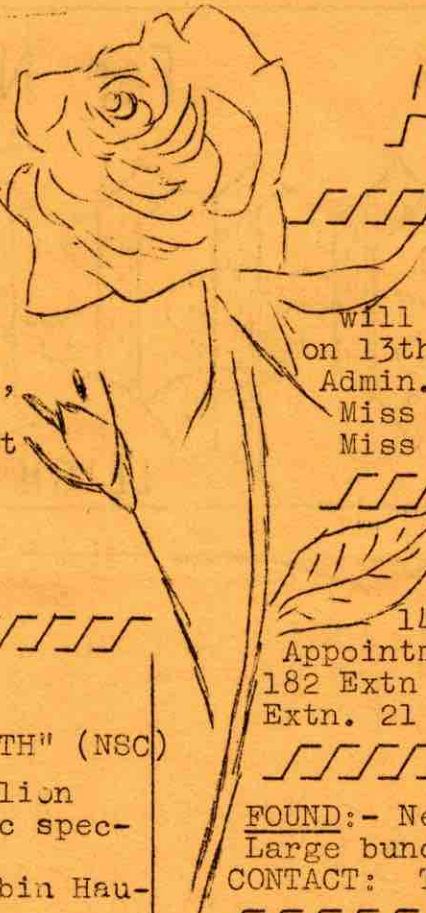



### AIR COOLERS

From time to time, we complain about the poor effect that our cooler has in the warmer weather. More often than not, the solution lies in our own hands.

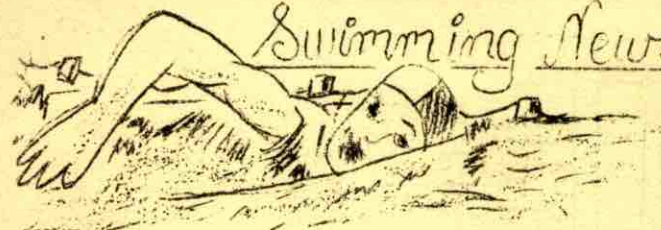
To maintain the best cooling from the evaporative air cooler, the following action should be taken:-

(a) Drain water regularly by removing the plug at the back of the cooler. During hot spells when coolers run almost continuously, drain them every second or third day. Make sure that the cooler is switched off while draining or cleaning.

(b) Every 3 weeks remove the accumulated dirt in the tank by switching off the cooler & stirring the water in the tank with a stick while draining. Access to the cooler is through the lift-off flap at the side of the cooler.

(c) Do not remove any part of the air cooler other than the inspection plate and drain plug.

The outcome was a very creditable performance of 3 firsts and 2 seconds made up as follows:-

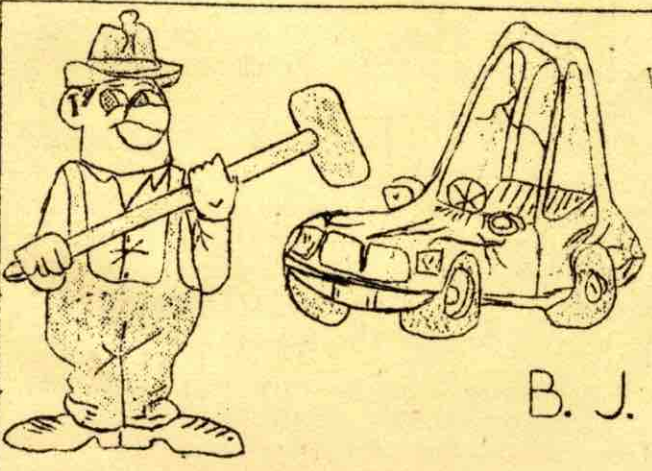

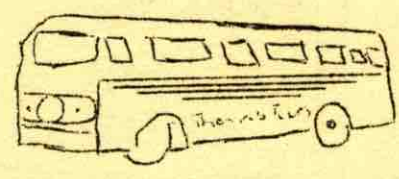

Spread them thinly on the surface of the soil & top up with another layer each time the lawn is mowed.

Lawns: need regular watering & can be given a light dressing of lawn manure or super & ammonia to keep them healthy. Lawnmowers should have the blades set higher in summer because grass cut short in hot weather burns easily & patches of lawn may die out. This is particularly so with the softer lawn grasses. Young shrubs & trees in lawns should have the lawn cut away from them for 2 or 3 feet. This lessens root competition from the lawn & they become established more quickly.

CITRUS TREES: need regular watering & feeding & should never be allowed to completely dry out. Suitable fertilisers include complete mineral mixture, blood & bone, sulphate of ammonia & urea. Dead twigs & branches should be cut out. Lawn should be removed from under citrus trees.

Trees & Shrubs: only the hardiest trees & shrubs can be planted out now. These include native gums & wattle, Hibiscus, Fiddlewood, Oleanders etc., & they must be well watered & looked after to survive the summer.

ROSES: should be regularly watered & spent blooms & dead stems removed.

Flowers: Portulacca, Marigolds, Zinnias & Petunias can still be planted out for a late summer show.

VEGETABLES: Cucumbers, French Beans, Sweet-corn, Lettuces (Great Lakes variety), Silver Beet, Red Beet, Radishes, Carrots, Parsnips, Turnips & early cabbages, Cauliflowers & Brussels sprouts - can be sown or planted out at present.

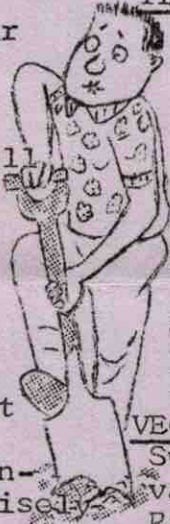

GARDENING NOTES FOR JANUARY

Watering: is the most important job at this time of year. Because our water supply is not unlimited, water should be used wisely and not wasted. In hot weather, watering in late afternoon & at night is more effective than in the heat of the day as water is not evaporated as quickly. With most sprinklers in use, a thorough soaking can be applied by leaving the sprinkler in each position for an hour or so. In summer, lawns need two good soakings a week rather than frequent light sprinklings. Fruit trees, vines, roses & shrubs appreciate a regular thorough soaking too.

MULCHING: refers to the practice of covering the surface of the soil around plants, shrubs, trees & vegetables with material such as lawn cuttings, straw, animal manure, sawdust, woodchips, black polythine or even gravel. This holds moisture in the soil by reducing evaporation; it thus means mulched areas do not need watering as much as other parts. It also keeps soil cool, smothers weed growth & organic mulches improve the soil because it rots down. Lawn cuttings are probably the best mulch to use here.

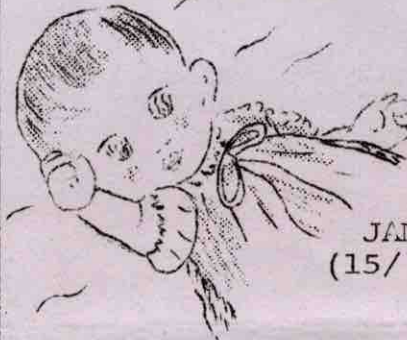
This issue we say a reluctant farewell to two of our 'long term' families.
