Juniors (Tue - Thur) are swimming 32 laps a night (approx $l^{\frac{1}{2}}$ miles a week).








Our Christmas dinner is on Dec 8 at the Canteen.



SCHOOL LIBRARIES COULD REPLACE INSTITUTE LENDING

The Education Department is now inviting small rural communities throughout the State to make application to establish Community School Libraries.

The Minister of Education, Dr Don Hopgood, said that Community School Libraries are designed to be established in small rural communities where the population served is less than 3,000.

An important condition is that a Community School Library can be established only in an area from which the school draws its students. All local councils involved as well as institutes in the area must agree to the establishment of the Community School Library under the terms of the guidelines set out in the report, 'Community use of school libraries'.

Dr Hopgood said that another condition is that all institutes must agree to dissolve in accordance with the provisions of the Libraries and Institutes Act.

He also said that in recent years there has been considerable increase in interest and activity in the development of community use of school libraries in small rural communities.

Dr Hopgood said the Government's policy aimed to encourage Institutes and local governing authorities in South Australia to co-operate in the provision of local library services, and that the objective is the development of a State-wide system of free subsidised libraries under the overall supervision of the Libraries' Board.

This will broaden and rationalise the availability of library services.

DETAILED WORKING SCHEME

Dr Hopgood said because it is realised that this situation could take a number of years to develop the Community School Libraries Committee was established. Its major task was to recommend to the Minister a detailed working scheme for community use of secondary school libraries in small rural communities. Dr Hopgood said that it was important that the community demonstrates interest in the scheme and the following procedure needs to be taken.

Discussions between the school, local government and institutes.


The setting up of a steering committee of interested local people.

Making a preliminary application for the establishment of a community school library.

Forming a Local Library Board of Management.

Making a formal application for the establishment of a Community School Library.

NATIONAL PORKS & WILDLIFE SERVICE

Over the last few months, quite a number of people have been asking for details of the GAMMON RANGES NATIONAL PARK - what it is, where, how big, access to it, etc.

The Gammon Ranges themselves are part of the North Flinders Chain, but are really a kind of 'Cross-Range' - in other words they are aligned more-or-less across the main range, being roughly east/west oriented. Geologically, they are composed mainly of massive pound quartzite.

The Gammon Ranges national park, dedicated in March 1970 and added to in September'71, has an area of about 15 540 Hectares (60 sq.m). This is about 40% of the total area of the Gammon Ranges, the rest still being under pastoral lease. It was originally dedicated as a "wilderness" national park.

The main access to the general area is via the Mt Serle/Yankaninna road, although there is no vehicle access into the park itself. The western and northern boundary fence of the park parallels the Mt Serle/Yankaninna road for about 29 km past Mt Serle to Yankaninna homestead. The fence is up to 1 km to the east of the road.

The place was originally designated a "wilderness", and that sums up the type of country it
is - steep, rugged ranges, dissected by gorges
and sheer cliffs. It is a place for experienced
bushwalkers, although some of the lower foothills
are reasonably accessable to casual visitors.

Recently there have been a few people going into the Gammons from the Mt Serle/Yankaninna road to shoot goats. This area IS A NATIONAL PARK and SHOOTING is NOT PERMITTED. Apart from the fact that it is illegal, common sense would highlight the dangers of using high powered rifles in an area where people are likely to be bushwalking. People wishing to camp on the flat country adjoining the park need permission from Yankaninna or Mt Serle before camping.


In the interest of safety, bushwalkers using the park need to notify the National Parks & Wildlife Service, particularly if over night stays are anticipated.




