On Sunday 19-12-71 a match was arranged between Leigh Creek and Blinman at Blinman Oval.

Due to the Christman Spirit, twelve very sick and seedy Creekers slowly drove to Blinman arriving, of course, a half an hour late. Fortunately for us, the opposing team was not any better.

With a limit of 30 overs each, Leigh Creek batted first and N McPherson 43 and P. Corbett 39 put us in a good position with the score at 0/78 at lunch after 14 overs. Then straight after lunch there was a major collapse, with D Ellis being the star, out first ball for nought, but due to some big hitting by the tailenders a respectable score of 160 was posted. Heroes of these being No 11 batsman C Lloyd 26, D Fee 20, R Wiles 13 and R Brand, who although not scoring many runs, held his end up for a last wicket partnership of 30.

A very confident bowling side lined up expecting a crushing victory over the Blinman side, but after 14 overs and the score at 0/84, our confidence had dwindled away to next to nothing. Finally Bill Corbett broke the partnership with the score at 90. From then on it was a procession of people walking backwards & forwards across the ground. The bowling heroes were R Wiles 5/24, P Corbett 5/47, with Bob Wiles taking two wickets in 2 balls in one over, only to surpassed by Bill Corbett in the next over who took 4 wickets in 6 balls, missing out on the hatrick on two occasions Blinman completely crashed to be all out for 120.
