You've bought or borrowed a gun and picture yourself striding home with a string of bunnies round your belt; gunpowder in your eyebrows; and a glow of health from a day in the great outdoors.

Many shooters have seen the picture but some never make it home! They either forget, or are the victim of someone who has forgotten, that guns and rifles are mainly designed for one purpose - TO KILL.

How a man handles a gun is one of the best character indicators there is. A weak character shows his lack of respect for himself and for others by thoughtlessly breaking every rule in the book; even though there are only 3 basic rules to break!

### No. 1

Know the condition of your piece - as they say in the army. In other words - IS IT LOADED or UNLOADED?

### No. 2

Know where the muzzle is pointed in relation to yourself and others at all times.

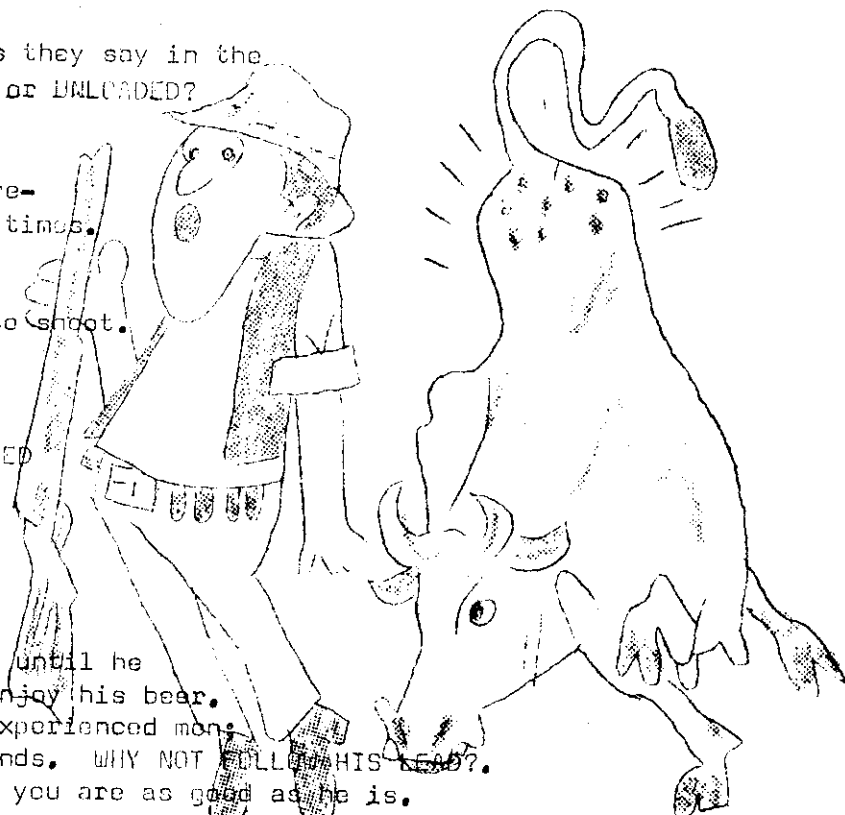
### No. 3

He learned his craft by shooting with experienced men; wary of hunting with inexperienced friends. WHY NOT FOLLOW HIS LEAD? Shoot with him - listen and learn; until you are as good as he is.
