Scout camp




A very successful and informal camp was held at Wandearah East, on the property of Mr Kevin Saint - approx. 9 miles out of Port Pirie.

Those taking part were; J C BARBERIEN (Scout Master), A MOYLE (Scouter Assisting), T MAPLE (Senior Scout) P MAPLE, P GRAY, G RAPPOLD, B HOOPER, C HOOPER and P WOOLDRIDGE.

A convoy of two well loaded station wagons left Leigh Creek 15 minutes behind schedule and arrived in Port Pirie 6½ hours later. Camp was set up by 3 pm and the day filled in at the home of Mr and Mrs Parker who invited us to stay for a barbeque. It took some time for the boys to settle in that night, but all were fast asleep by 10 pm. Scouters were woken at 5 15am next morning and the first full day of camp commenced. The beach day to Port Broughton turned out to be too cold and windy, so the rest of the day was spent building a "Flying Fox" (Bowswains Chair) across a creek, back at camp.

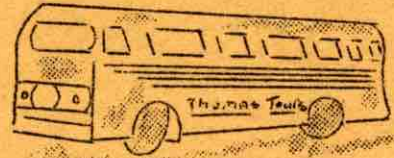

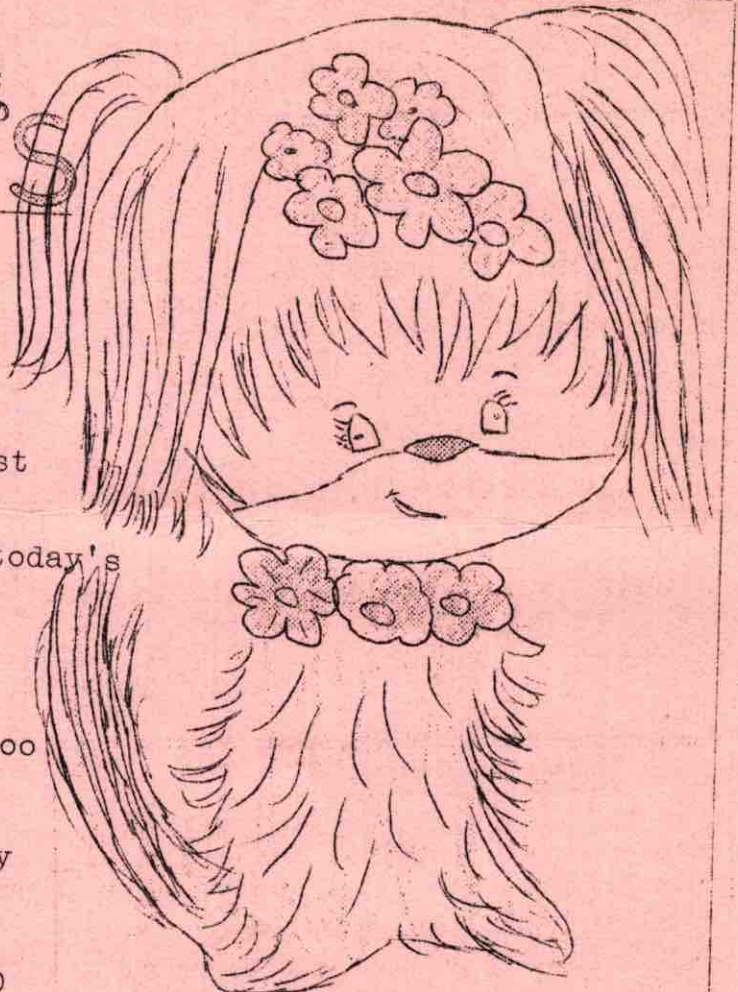

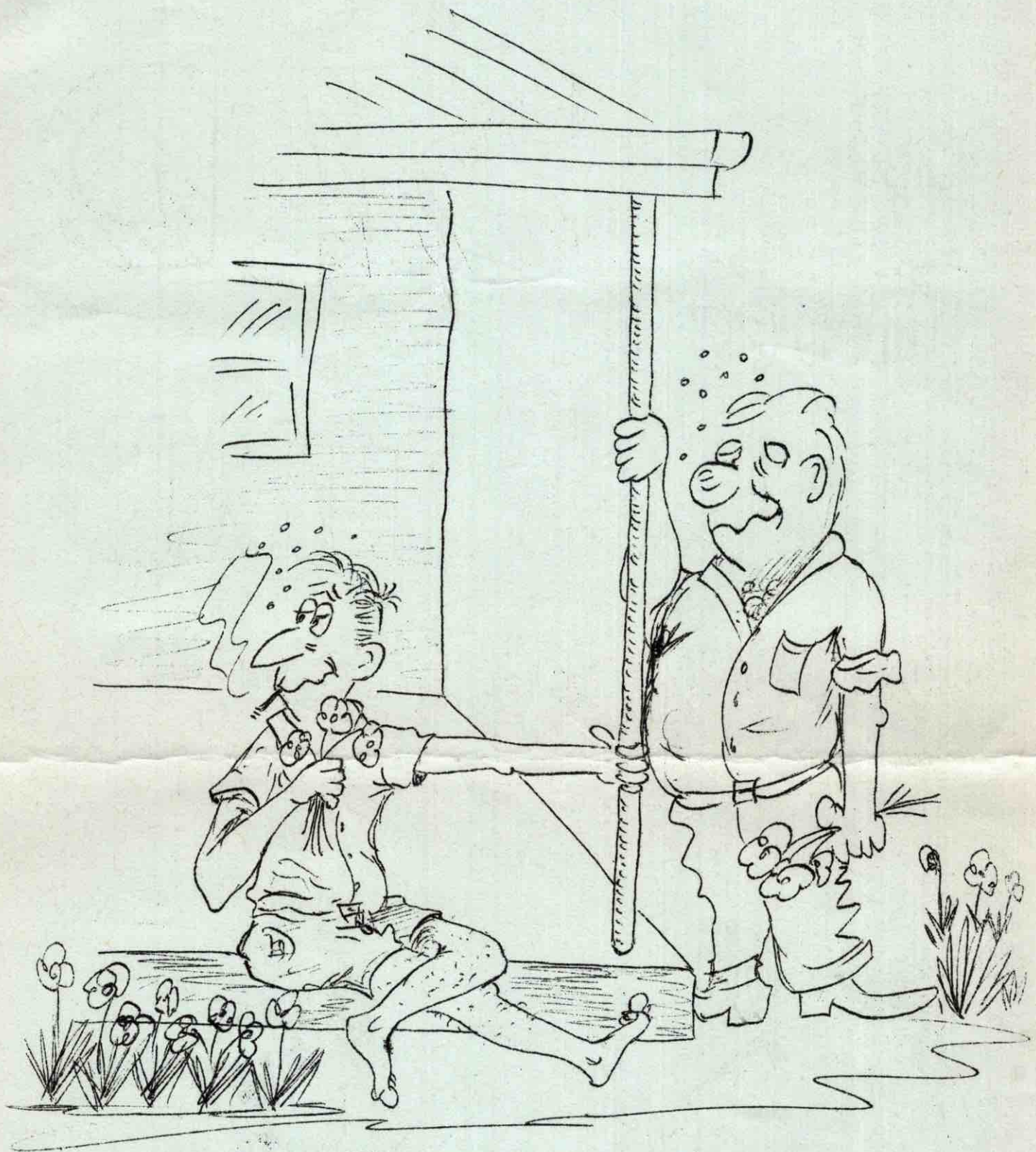
