***** BUSHEIRE PREVENTION - BARBECUES *****

On any day during the Fire danger season - from 1 November 1977 to 30 April 1978 that is not declared a fire ban day you may light any sort of fire in the open provided that -

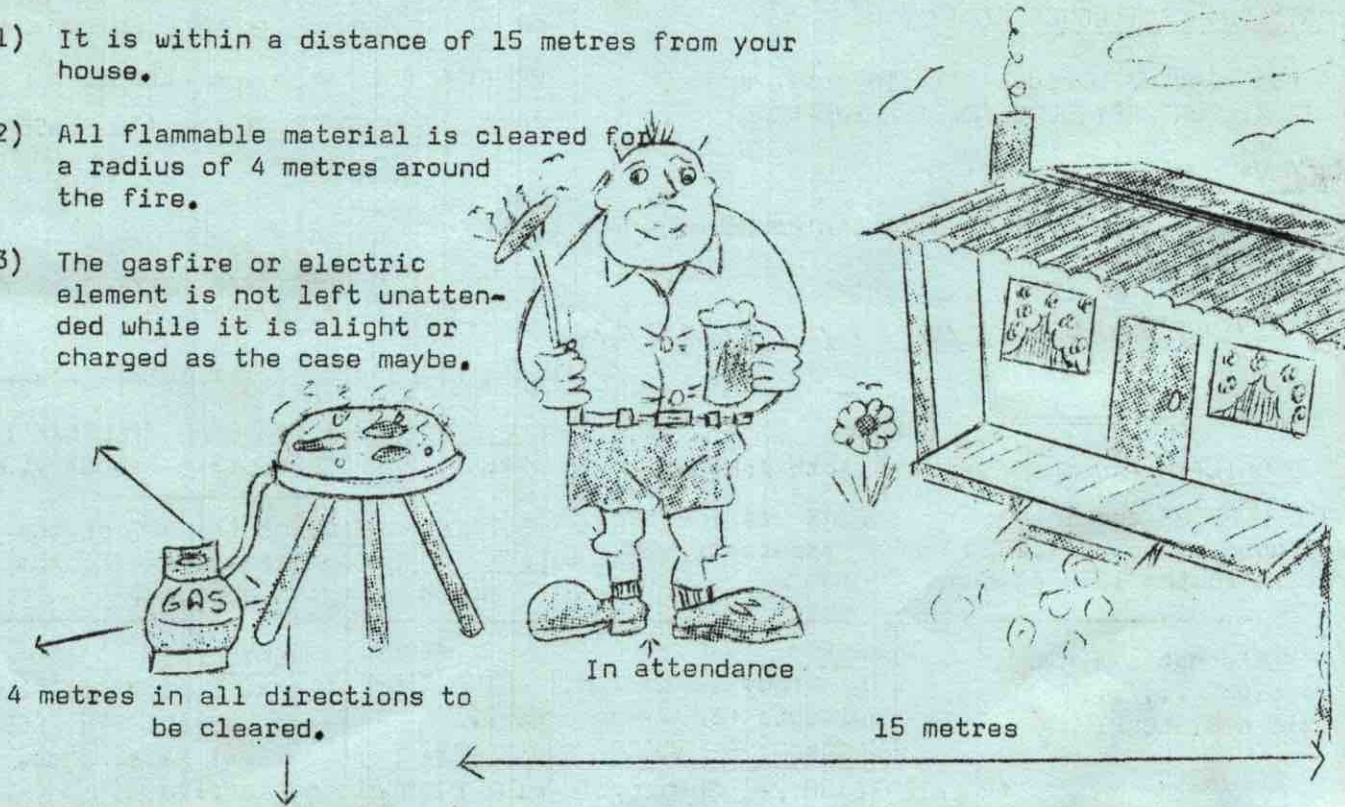
- (1) A space for a radius of 4 metres around the fire is cleared of all flammable bush grass and other material.
- (2) A person who is able to control the fire is in attendance from the time the fire is lighted until it is completely extinguished.

BUT!

What happens if you are about to have a barbecue in your own backyard - Mum's made all the goodies and everybody but the neighbours cat has been invited and then you hear the good news - TOTAL FIRE BAN? - DON'T DESPAIR!

You cannot have or light a fire, but you may use a GAS FIRE or ELECTRIC ELEMENT in your yard provided that -

- (1) It is within a distance of 15 metres from your house.
- (2) All flammable material is cleared for a radius of 4 metres around the fire.
- (3) The gasfire or electric element is not left unattended while it is alight or charged as the case maybe.

years.

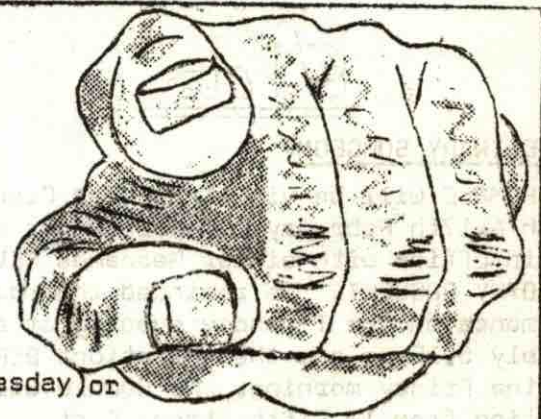

WEDDING OF INTEREST

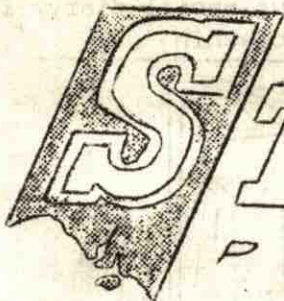

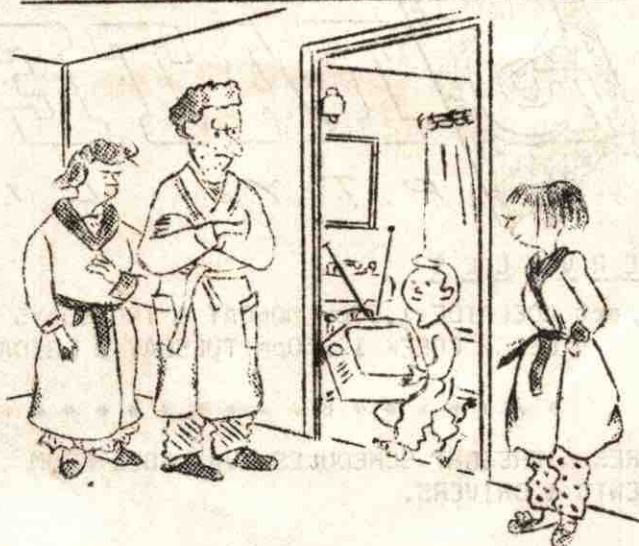
