KANGAROOS



The chairman of the Far Northern Development Association, Mr R Ragless said today that his organisation fully supported the Stockowner's Association in opposing the ban by the Federal Government on the exports of kangaroos and their by-products.

Mr Ragless said that this legislation seemed in direct contrast to the S.A. State Planning Authority's policy of controlled grazing. He felt that Government officials and conservationists were not fully aware of how quickly the kangaroo population could reach plague proportions in some areas if certain controls were not maintained.

It appeared that in a matter of time, Parliamentarians and other Government Officials would be put under pressure to re-introduce the controls which at present limited the size of animals which could be harvested and which were proving very effective in maintaining a satisfactory numbers rate.



Nobody wanted to see the kangaroo exterminated, Mr Ragless said, but with pastoralists providing watering points for other stock, there was never any chance of the kangaroo becoming extinct through drought or shooting.



ISOLATED CHILDREN'S PARENTS' ASSOCIATION

An executive member of the I C P A., Mr R Ragless, said he had been advised by an Education Dept. official that forms for aid for isolated children as recently announced by the Federal Member for Education were not yet available, but would be circularised as soon as possible.

He pointed out that children from country schools not appropriately equipped with educational facilities to carry them on to a higher level were eligible.

Some people had misunderstood that aid was only available for those children not attending a recognised school. It has always been I C P A policy that all children be given an equal educational opportunity.

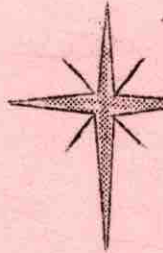

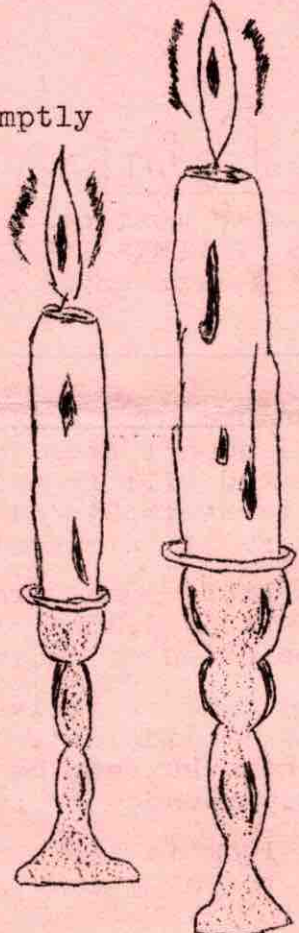

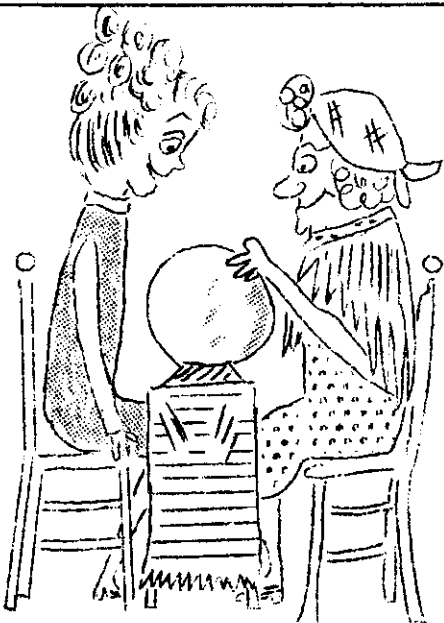

Dear "GREEN THUMB"
 Three little queries which I'm sure you can help me with.
 What should I do with my roses at this time of the year?
 Why is my fruit so small this year?
 What vegetables and flowers can be planted now?
 (Mr 'L')

Answers:

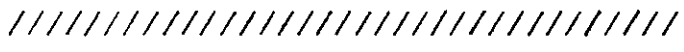
Towards the end of February roses can be lightly pruned; dead wood and small twigs removed and then fed with a complete fertiliser. Watering can be increased slightly & this should ensure a good show of autumn roses. Chrysanthemums also can be forced along with some fertiliser and the centres nipped out to form strong bushy plants.

Fruit trees & vines should still be watered after fruit has been picked. Last years dry winter and the recent hot weather is probably the reason for many trees bearing small sized fruit.

Annual flowers which can be planted from now on include; Stocks, larkspurs, cornflowers, calendulas, hollyhocks, pansies, wallflowers, linaria and clarkia. These are all hardy & do well under Leigh Creek conditions. Vegetables that can be sown or planted now include; Cabbage, cauliflowers, brussels sprouts, carrots, onions, silver beet, sweet corn, (cont.

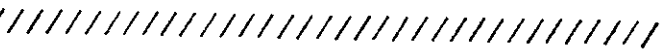
"GREEN THUMB" (cont..
 radish, beetroot, lettuce and beans. Hardy bulbs such as fresias, ranunculi and anemones make a good show here and other bulbs such as daffodils & hyacinths can be planted now too, but need more attention.

REMEMBER to use mulch to conserve water.



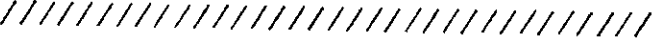

MEMO TO ALL DEPARTMENT HEADS:

RE: STANDARD PROCEDURE INSTRUCTIONS
ON DEATH OF EMPLOYEES

It has recently been brought to the attention of this office that many employees have been dying whilst on duty, for apparently no good reason. Furthermore, some employees are refusing to fall over after they are dead. THIS PRACTICE MUST STOP AT ONCE!

On and after March 1, 1973, any employee found sitting up after he or she has died, will be dropped from the pay roll at once without an investigation, under Rule 29, Section B.

Where it can be proved that an employee is being held up by a desk or typewriter, or any other support, which is the property of the Firm, a 90 day period of grace will be granted.

* * * * *

The following procedure will be adhered to:-

If, after some hours, it is noted that an employee has not moved or changed position, the Department Head will investigate.

Because of the sensitive nature of our employees, and close resemblance between death and their natural working attitude, the investigations will be made quietly so as to prevent the waking of an employee if he or she is asleep.

If some doubt exists as to the true condition, extending a pay cheque is the final test. If an employee does not reach for it, it may be reasonable to assume that death has occurred.

NOTE!

In some cases, however, the instinct is too strongly developed that spasmodic clutching at the cheque may occur. DO NOT LET THIS FOOL YOU!

In all cases, a signed statement by the dead person MUST be given on a special form provided for this purpose.

Fifteen (15) copies will be required; 3 to be sent to Adelaide and two to the deceased. The others will be PROMPTLY LOST in the Departmental files.
