

At various Bar-b-ques held over the last few months a new food was introduced. It looked like meat on wooden sticks and in actual fact that's what it is. It's called "SARTEES" and is a form of Chinese cooking.

For those interested, the recipe is as follows: -

2 1b. topside steak

1 tablespoon dry or medium dry wine

soya sauce

brandy

hot curry powder or 2 heaped teaspoons mild curry powder

1 dessertspoon salt


2 segments garlic

1 desertspoon sugar

Cut meat in 1" cubes, Crush garlic, marinate meat in ingredients for 24 hours. Thread meat on wooden skewers and grill over open fire or hotplate

The type of curry powder to be used is to your own taste, the hotter the powder, the hotter your Sartees. Perhaps you could mix a little mild with a little hot. The wooden skewers are hard to get here or rather unobtainable but the long steel skewers used at bar-b-ques are quite alright. When wooden skewers are used normally about 5 to 6 pieces of meat are put




DARWIN RELIEF FUND






