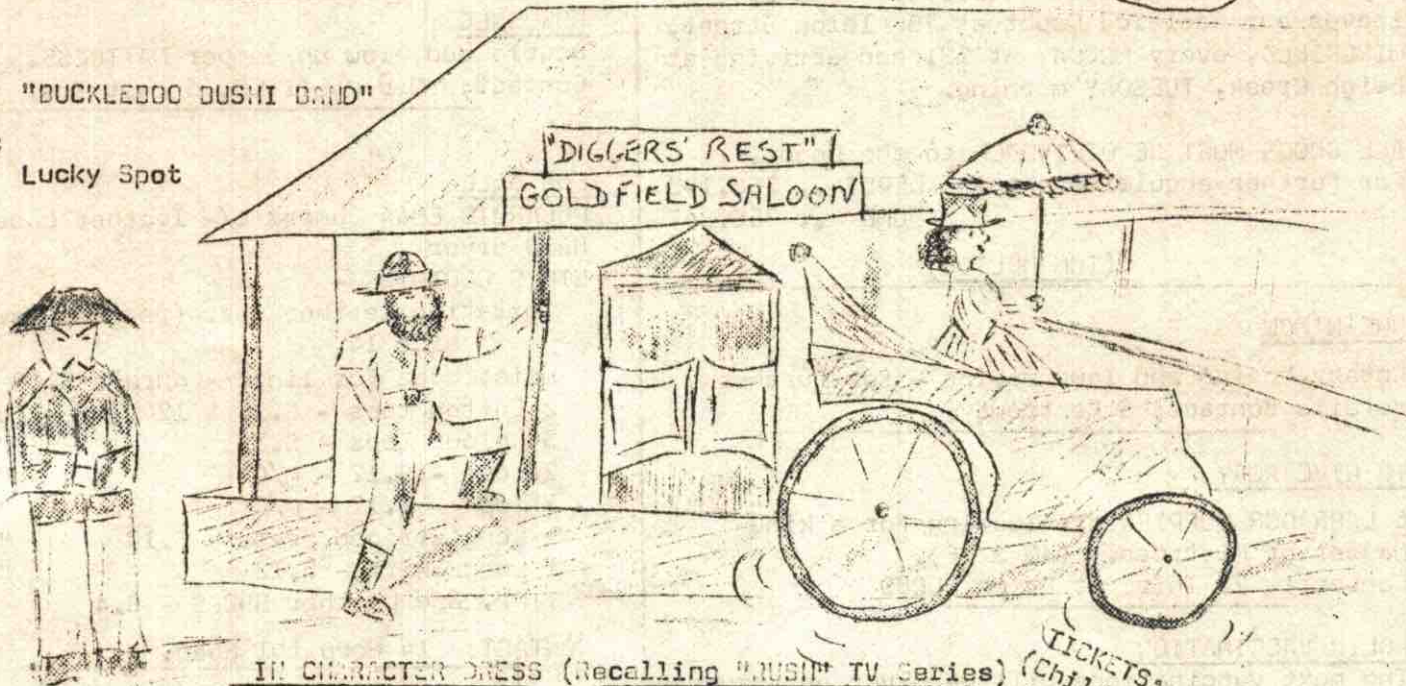

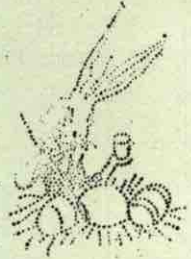

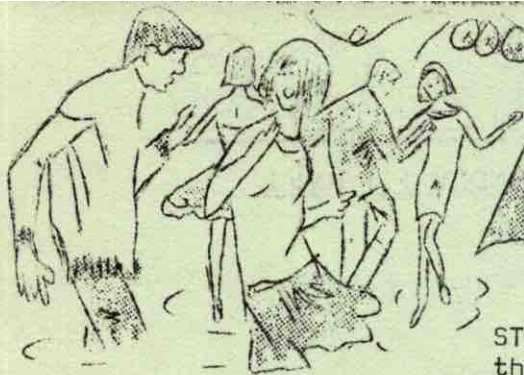

Dear Mr Barber,

I have received your letter written on 13th February in which you refer to the Government undertaking to reintroduce the Fuel Rationalisation Scheme.

Your memory is correct with respect to the Prime Minister's undertaking during the election campaign that the Government plans to introduce a fuel price equalisation scheme which had been abandoned by the previous Federal Labor Government.

I understand that the scheme will be phased in over a three year period and the ultimate objective being to ensure that country prices are brought down initially to less than one cent per litre above city prices and to less than half a cent per litre in the life of the new Parliament.

For your information this matter has been listed for discussion at the Eyre Peninsula Local Government Conference to be held at Streaky Bay on 27th February and I have already written to the appropriate Minister asking him for further details as to when the Government proposes taking action in this regard. As soon as I receive his reply I will write to you again.
