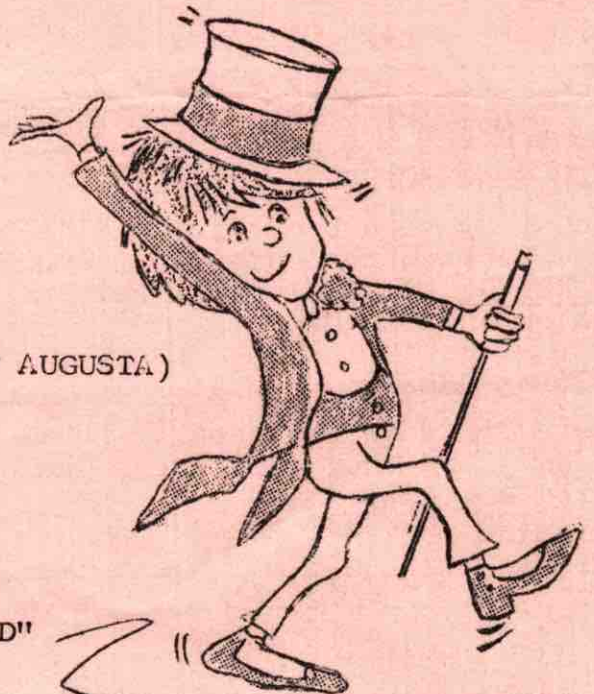

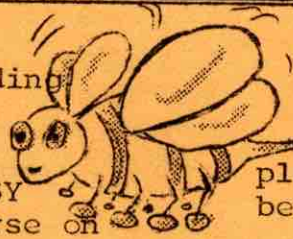

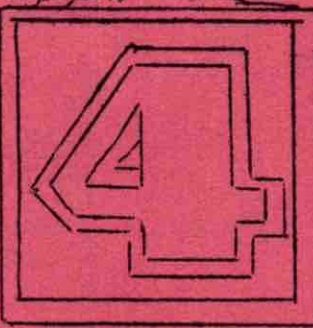

Interstate awards include five First awards at Royal South Street (Ballarat) Competitions (the Grand National Eisteddfod of Australasia) and three First awards in the Choral Championships of Victoria held at Bendigo.

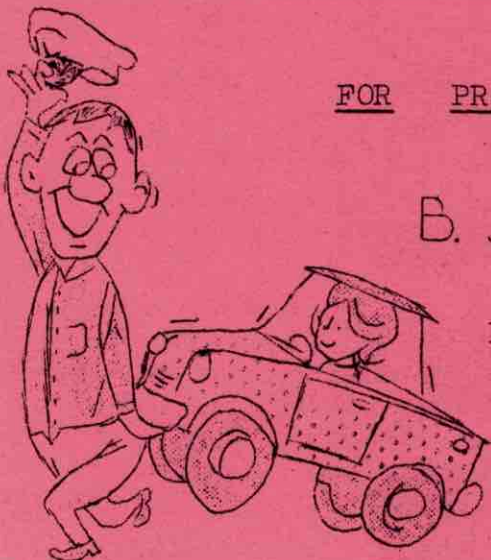

Meeting will elect new officers for the coming year and arrange a programme.

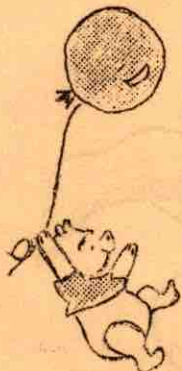
All "shutter bugs" are welcome and we hope to see a good roll up. Each person bring three of their best slides for general discussion.
