If you want your car picked up or delivered, phone LEO VASILUNAS at the school.



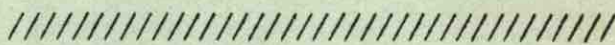
The Student Representative Council helps to serve the school by raising money to buy amenities for the students and acts as a Liaison between the students and the teachers.

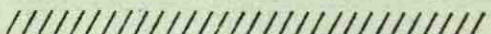

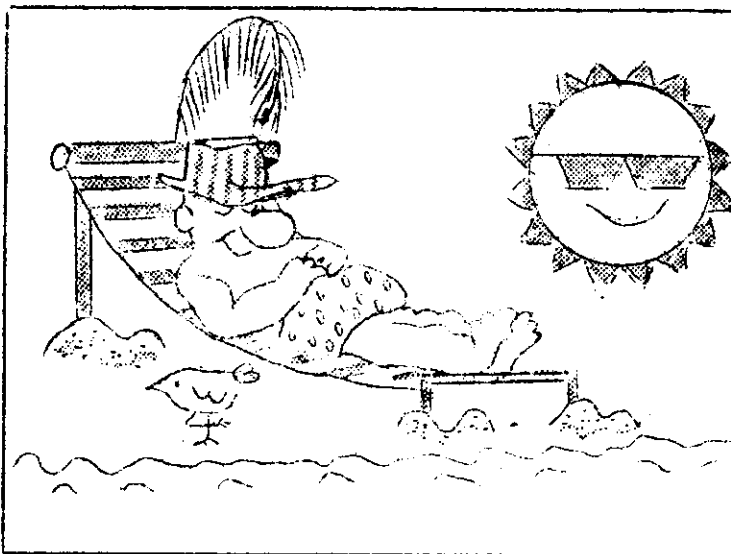

Green Thumb

March is in some ways a betwixt month, as our summer lingers on, though officially autumn is upon us.

If you have some space in the vegetable garden you must now decide whether to plant one last crop of quick maturing summer growers like beans, zucchinis, sweet corn or cucumbers or leave the space for a few more weeks while you grow some seedling broccoli, cauliflower and brussell sprouts.

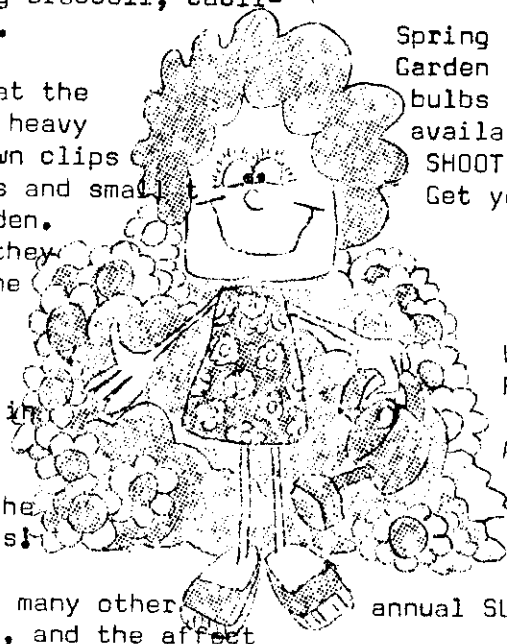
Weeds are doing extra well at the moment following the recent heavy rains. Make good use of lawn clips to mulch areas around shrubs and small trees and the vegetable garden. Try to remove weeds before they seed, thus saving work in the future.

Weedicides are to be avoided as much as possible in the home garden. Several people have recently used a weedicide called Vorox and the results have been disastrous!

Mature stone fruit trees and many other ornamentals have been killed, and the affect lasts for well over a year.

My advise is DON'T TOUCH VOROX despite the grand stories about this wonder weedicide. It's far too dangerous. If couch grass is a problem, and we all know it is a BIG problem, a final try may be made with "DOWPON". This is most effective when sprayed on lush grass after a good watering. No guarantee can be given, but it is the best chance available and relatively safe.

Spring bulbs can be planted soon. The Garden Club will place a bulk order for bulbs before Easter. Catalogues are available from PAM LEPA and PETER SHOOTER at the Administration Office. Get your orders in as soon as possible.

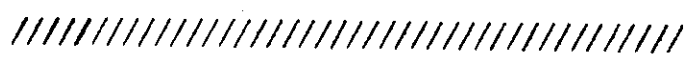

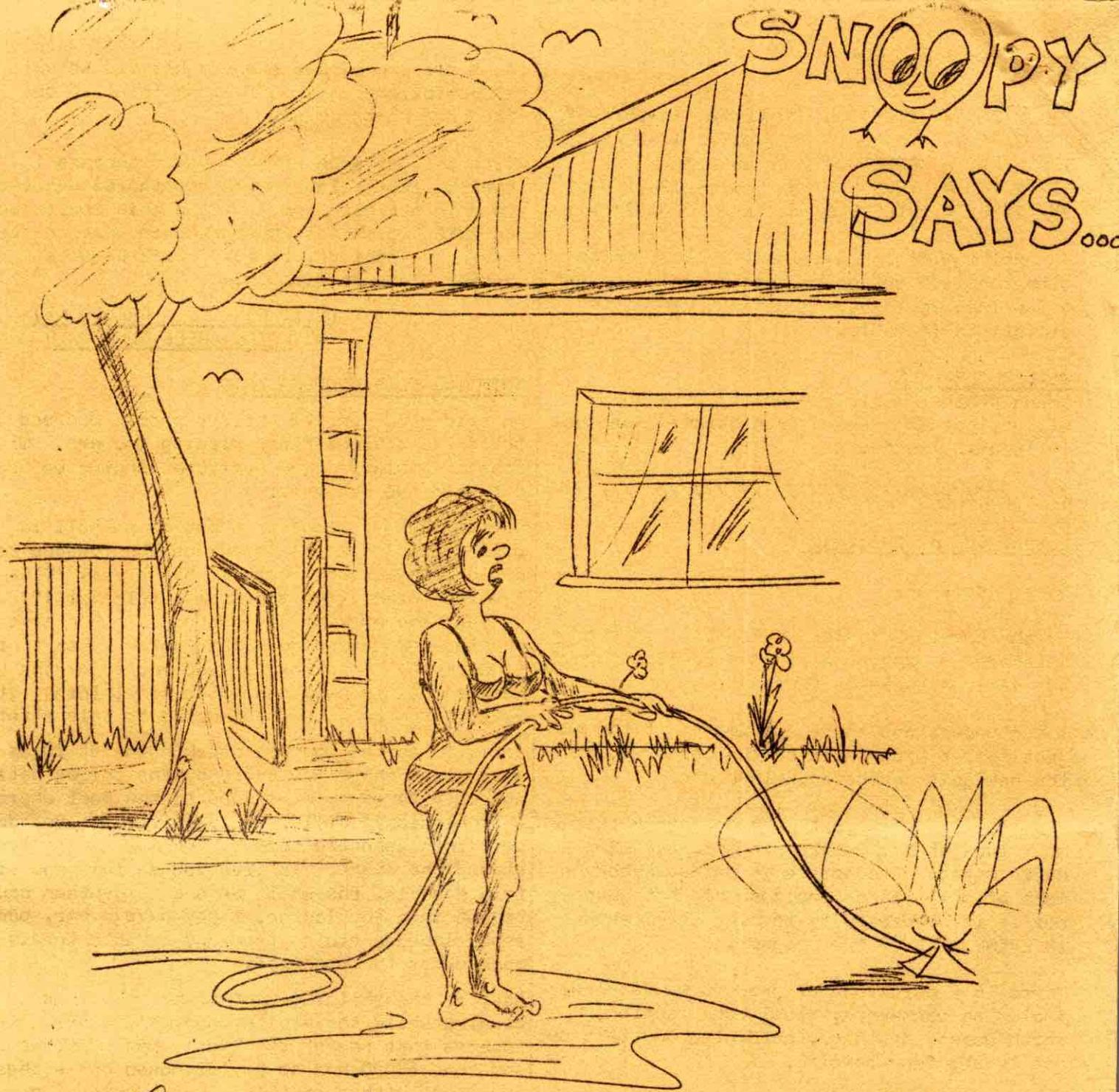
