DUCK

- Opens: 6.am 16th February 1974  
Closes: 10.pm 29th June 1974

BAG LIMIT: - 12 Birds per day of the following species only:-

Wood Duck (Maned Goose)  
Black Duck  
Mountain Duck  
Grey Teal  
Chestnut teal  
Blue Winged Shoveller  
Pink Eared Duck  
White-eyed Duck (Hard head)

NO eggs of any species of Duck are to be taken during the open seasons.

QUAIL

- Stubble Quail

Opens : 6.am 6th April 1974  
Closes: 10.pm 27th July 1974

In that portion of the State, North of Latitude 36°.

BAG LIMIT: - 25 Birds per day

The eggs of Stubble Quail are NOT to be taken during this open season.

GUN LICENCE:

NO GUN LICENCE IS REQUIRED for the 1974 Open Seasons.

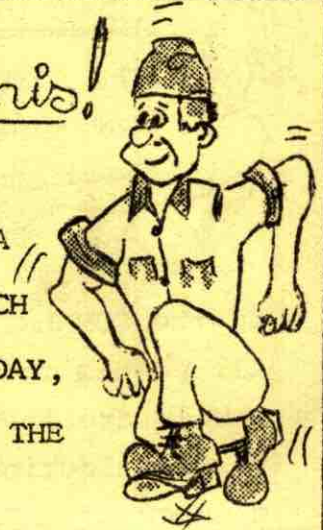

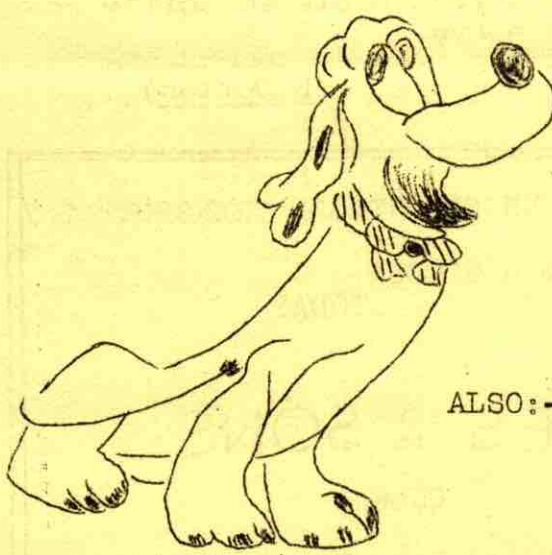

Mother of "our Kevin Waters", recently lifted an old floor covering under which she discovered an Advertiser dated 20 November, 1943. Two articles on Leigh Creek were discovered and below is an extract from these interesting items.

## "WAR AT LEIGH CREEK OPENS

The Australian Workers' Union has called a meeting of its members at Leigh Creek for tonight, and will thus fire the first shot in the war which is likely to develop between the AWU and the Miners' Federation.

Mr Galvin (AWA Industrial Officer), said today he had found discontent among his members over tobacco, messing facilities and lack of suitable accommodation.

Some Balts will be present at the AWU meeting tonight. There are about 40 Balts on the field, and it is likely they will be granted representation on the AWU."

## "PREMIER'S FAITH IN LEIGH CREEK

The Premier (Mr Playford), in announcing yesterday that the first coal from Leigh Creek would be on sale in Adelaide in January, expressed his confidence in the future of the field.

Discussing the withdrawal of Commonwealth Government support, Mr Playford said that he believed that public opinion would overwhelmingly support this attempt to provide some security in fuel supplies, and that it would sweep aside any attempts, sincere or otherwise, to sabotage the venture.

Mr Playford said that the first coal from the field would be delivered in Adelaide in January. The Government Stores Department would be entrusted with the sale, which would be at 25/- a ton on truck lots at Mile End."
