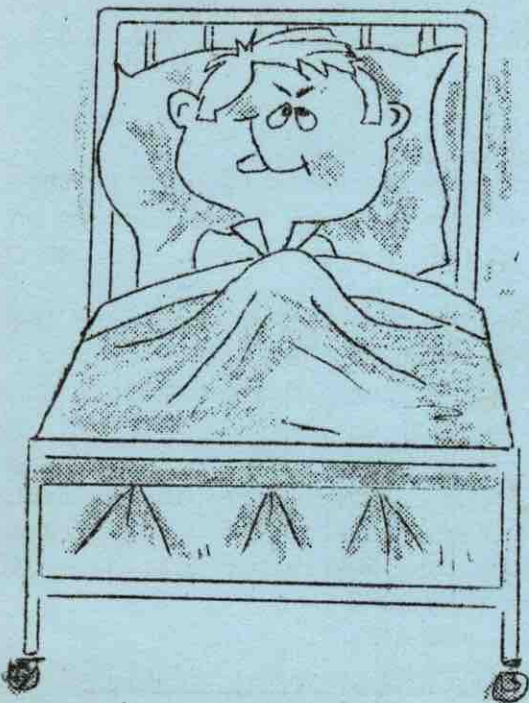

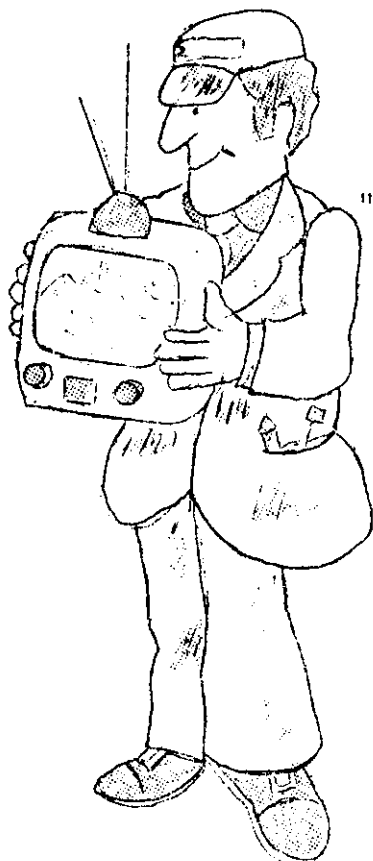

The big question for some time now has been "WHO CAN ADJUST AND SERVICE COLOUR SETS HERE?". We have purchased the necessary equipment to enable us to adjust the picture to its optimum settings of purity (even-ness of colour) and convergence (aligning of colours). Also plans are well in hand for a very competent local person to service the sets if any problems do develop. This person will be available to anyone who needs him. For extended repairs to sets that we sell we will have a loan colour set on standby.

Of these AWA - THORN - RANK ARENA and SANYO will be carried as STOCK LINES and are all highly recommended. Always keep in mind that most sets, regardless of country of origin, have Japanese picture tubes and components.

If you personally get a quote on the above brands elsewhere, we will do our best to match the quote, and enquiry will cost you NOTHING. All sets require a check after unpacking as problems arise in storage and transport, also 22" and 26" sets require a full sequence of adjustments in actual viewing position.

The following are some handy HINTS - Never position a TV set closer than 6 or 8 feet from speakers or other items that generate a magnetic field. AVOID vacuuming around a colour set that is operating and NEVER switch the cleaner or other appliances off or on within 8 feet of a TV set, whether it is operating or not.

Switching modern sets off and on does not harm them as was the case in the past, and reducing brightness, contrast and sound only serves to wear out these particular controls. However, when purchasing a secondhand black and white set, check visually that the centre of the screen has not lost its coating. This can be seen when the set is off.

Sunlight must never fall on the screen itself. Consider remote control even for one channel, minor adjustments are often necessary with programme changes and these are best done from the viewing position. Often sound level has to be varied etc. A remote control set is an investment for many years and the local one channel may not always apply.

We have been assured that no problems should exist using an antenna which sits on top of the TV set, however, if ghosting or poor picture does occur a 2 element exterior antenna will solve the problem at little cost. We will be stocking both of these items.

The following letter was posted to Senator D S Jessop on the 7th February 1977.

"Dear Sir,

At a committee meeting of the above Assoc of 4th Feb., the stagnation and deterioration of Government services in both Frome and Wakefield were discussed at length.

The following is nothing new to you, but we feel it is time some definite decisions on policy for this area be made.

With stagnation we talk of the local telephone services, the only twenty four hour service in this area is at Leigh Creek, others - Lyndhurst; Copley; Beltana; Parachilna etc., operate on varying timetables - 9.am to 6.pm; 9.am to 8.pm and 9.am to 9.am to 9.pm weekdays, to midday on Saturdays, some open for 1 hour on Sundays and Public Holidays while others remain closed.

The deteriorating services are - Rail; air and road. Rail has deteriorated from a twice weekly service to Adelaide of a 9 hour duration to a once weekly service of 14 hours duration. With the train travelling south on Fridays and north on Mondays no time is allowed for business once in Adelaide, short of staying for a week. Air Services have deteriorated just as dramatically as the train, from 5 services per week with TAA then with TAA and Ansett with first class seating and facilities to a third rate service operated by Pagas with, depending on loading, sometimes most uncomfortable seating with no facilities for what we are told is one of the highest costs per kilometer in Australia, although the flights are frequent enough.

At least sealing of the road north of Hawker has commenced and is programmed to proceed at an average of one mile per month, meaning approximately 9 years to complete Hawker to Leigh Creek - this is far too slow.

With monies saved by -

- 1) not being serviced by TAA or Ansett
- 2) 50% reduction in Ghan services

isn't it reasonable for these savings to be made available to the SA Highways Department specifically to speed up the sealing of the Hawker to Marree main road?

If satisfactory answers to our plight are not forthcoming we intend arranging a deputation with the appropriate Ministers.
