ALP TEAM TOUR NORTH

ALP Candidate for the State Electorate of Eyre, MICHAEL SACHSSE, accompanied by his Campaign Director, Mike Mulvihill, the State Organiser for the A.L.P, Chris Schacht, and the Federal Party Organiser, Ken Bennett, recently completed a tour of the North taking in the towns of Hawker, Leigh Creek and Marree.

At Leigh Creek the group met with the local A.L.P. Sub Branch and the C.U.C. to discuss issues of mutual interest. They then met with residents at the Leigh Creek canteen where a number of local issues were raised with the candidate.

Before leaving Leigh Creek Micheal Sachsse pointed out that he intended to return to the town in the near future to carry out a door knock and to outline his policies for the area at a public meeting. He was forced to cancel these functions from his recent itinerary because of a clash with the commissioning of television at Leigh Creek.

Other highlights of the tour included successful door knocks at Hawker and Marree. A public meeting at Marree resulted in the raising of such issues as education and the future of the town after the completion of the Alice Springs/Tarcoola rail link, a subject on which Micheal promised to keep the people of Marree fully briefed.
