## "A VISIT BY AN INTERNATIONAL ARTIST"

On Friday night May 21st at the Community Hall, the Leigh Creek Dramatic Club, through the Arts Council of Australia will sponsor a concert by Ronald Woodcock, violin, and Louise Britton, piano.

RONALD WOODCOCK studied at the New South Wales Conservatorium from 1948 to 1950 where he obtained his Teachers' and Performers' Diploma, in London with Jack Kessler in 1953, in Belgium with Arthur Grumiaux and in Prades with Pablo Casals.

He has toured giving solo recitals and school concerts in 32 countries including England, Belgium, Germany, India, South Africa, East and West Pakistan and Malaysia.

He has broadcast from the B.B.C., Radiodiffusion Francaise, Radio Nederland, Radio Eireann, A.B.C., Kenya Broadcasting Corp. and numerous other networks throughout the world.

He has been televised in London, Sydney, Bangkok, Perth, Melbourne, Albuquerque (New Mexico), Kuala Lumpur, Singapore and Hong Kong.

Mr. Woodcock has appeared as soloist with the Boyd Neel Orchestra in London, and with symphony orchestras in Brussels, Sydney, Melbourne, Perth, Adelaide, Johannesburg, Capetown, Durban, Calcutta, Bulawayo, Mauritius, Penang and Colombo.

His interests include Conducting, Teaching, Chamber Music, Athletics, International Politics and Travelling off the beaten track.

LOUISE BRITTON studied piano and viola at the Capetown College of Music and the Vienna Academy.

She has toured as piano accompanist for Ronald Woodcock since 1960, giving concerts in Africa, South-East Asia, India and Australia, and has played the viola as a member of the Capetown and Durban symphony orchestras.
