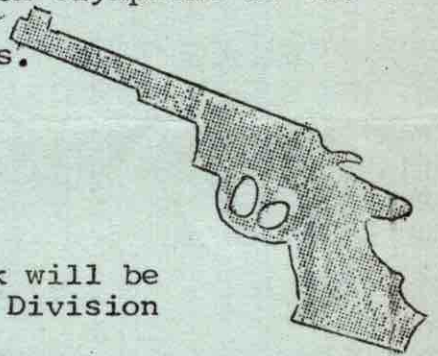

This year for the first time, Leigh Creek will be having an entrant in the South Australia Division of the Miss Australia Quest.

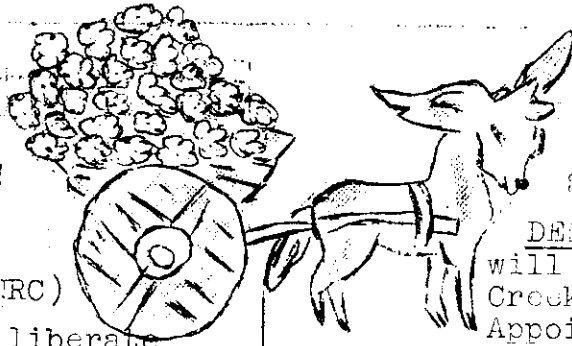
Funds raised from this will aid the Spastic Centre at Woodville.

1. Switch off power at stove or switchboard.

3. Cover stove air vents with wet towelling or wet paper.
4. Allow oven to cool before opening.
5. If out of control act as for (5) previous column.

STOVE FIRES

Points to remember when using your stove. These are published in the interest of your safety.

REMEMBER!

The majority of stove fires are caused by human error - take care that elements are switched off after use, or the correct element is switched on. Adjust your stove or hotplate to the right temperature and be aware at all times of what you have left cooking. Don't leave any fat or oil on the hotplate if you are not cooking and don't store fat or oil in the oven.

PROCEDURE IN CASE OF FIRE

Top of Stove - Burning Fat or Oil:

1. Switch off power at stove or switchboard.
2. Push burning article to one side of hotplate - do not attempt to remove burning article from stove.
3. Cover article with metal tray or larger pan, wet towelling or wet newspaper, being careful not to splash water on to fat.
4. Do not use water to extinguish fat or oil fires.
5. If it is out of your control ring a fire alarm or report it to the Post Office Exchange. The Emergency Number is 199.

HINTS from "GREEN THUMB"

Annual Flowers - Some of the best annuals for spring display at Leigh Creek which flower during the garden competition

include:-

Alyssum, Sweet Peas, Ranunculi, Calendula, Chirley Poppy, Virginian Stock, Linaria, Stocks, Cornflowers, Anemone, Larkspurs and Wallflowers.

These can all be planted NOW. Sturt Peas make a magnificent display and one worth trying. Sow the seeds in a sunny open area in light soil. They should not be over watered.

Shrubs - Most ornamental shrubs can be planted now. Some of the best for this area include:- Spanish Broome, Fiddlewoods, Bottlebrush, various Recomas, Hibiscus, Pampas Grass & Poinsettia. Many of the native shrubs are well suited to the area and are spectacular in bloom - don't forget these.

FAUNA INSPECTOR - LEIGH CREEK

The National Parks and Wildlife service, the State Fauna Authority, has just appointed a fauna inspector to Leigh Creek.

Mr BRENTON ARNOLD, living at 28 Sec. Ave., will be primarily concerned with policing the NP and WLS Act & regulations. This will involve a lot of field work in the Far North as his inspection area extends from about Parachilna in the South, to Innamincka in the NE and the Musgrave Ranges in the NW. The co-operation of people living in this area will be sought at every opportunity to assist in the conservation and collection of knowledge of our native fauna.

Since the inception of the service in June, last year, there have been a lot of changes in laws and regulations concerning wildlife. There are now very few native animals, including birds, that can be taken from the wild or kept in captivity, without a permit.

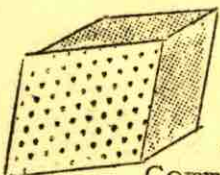

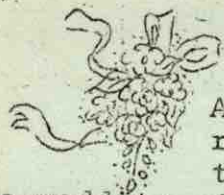

Air Services - Leigh Creek

Many thanks for your letter re-
the above which I received yes-
terday.

As you mentioned they are not
satisfactory answers and we do
feel that both yourself and the
people of this area are being
"given the run around."

I rang DCA a couple of weeks ago
and it was suggested that we con-
tact our local Member. The plain
facts are that as from 4 May, '73
(this Friday), the south bound
Friday service will cease to op-
erate, leaving us with the Tues-
day north to Alice Springs and
return to Adelaide, only.
(Incidentally, today's Friendship
only went to Oodnadatta).

On the grapevine, we heard that
Ansett has been trying to in-
terest a Central Australian Air-
line in the Fridays run. It
makes us wonder who is directing
operations, the airlines or DCA.

Why, as we suggested, Arkaroola
Air Services, cannot be given the
whole run, is beyond us.

The situation has got to the
stage where I feel that the Mini-
ster, who-ever he may be, should
be asked in the House what is
intended with internal airservices
such as ours.

My dear Minister,

I have had a great deal of cor-
respondence with your department
regarding the problem of an air
service to Leigh Creek. This is
an isolated township that is in
real need of a regular air ser-

vice, but over the years the regularity of this air service has been
whittled away. The last letter that I had from the Far Northern Develop-
ment Assoc., who write to me regularly on this matter is that they expect
to only have one TAA service up and one TAA service back on the Tuesday
of each week. The Ansett service that was calling in when going south
to Adelaide has been cancelled.

There have been many suggestions put forward to relieve the position and
one that seems eminently sensible is to allow Arkaroola Airservices to
assume responsibility for serving the town. This is a small airline that
flies regularly to Arkaroola which is fairly close to Leigh Creek.

Letter from C R KELLY (cont..)

It flies 3 times a week, I understand, for a good part of the year. But during the tourist season, flies more frequently than this. I understand that this air service is willing and able to divert to Leigh Creek and the cost of the service would be, I believe, very close to, if not the same, as TAA service and it would be more regular and seems an ideal solution.

Whether this solution is the right one is difficult for a layman such as myself to say, but I can assure you quite definitely that, in my opinion, a better service for the district is needed and certainly this is an opinion shared by people who live in the area. And if this improved service can be obtained by giving the run to a smaller company that is equipped to service this kind of inland run, then I think it would be a good solution.

I would be grateful if you could have this matter examined and let me have an answer I can send back to the people in this area who are very much concerned.

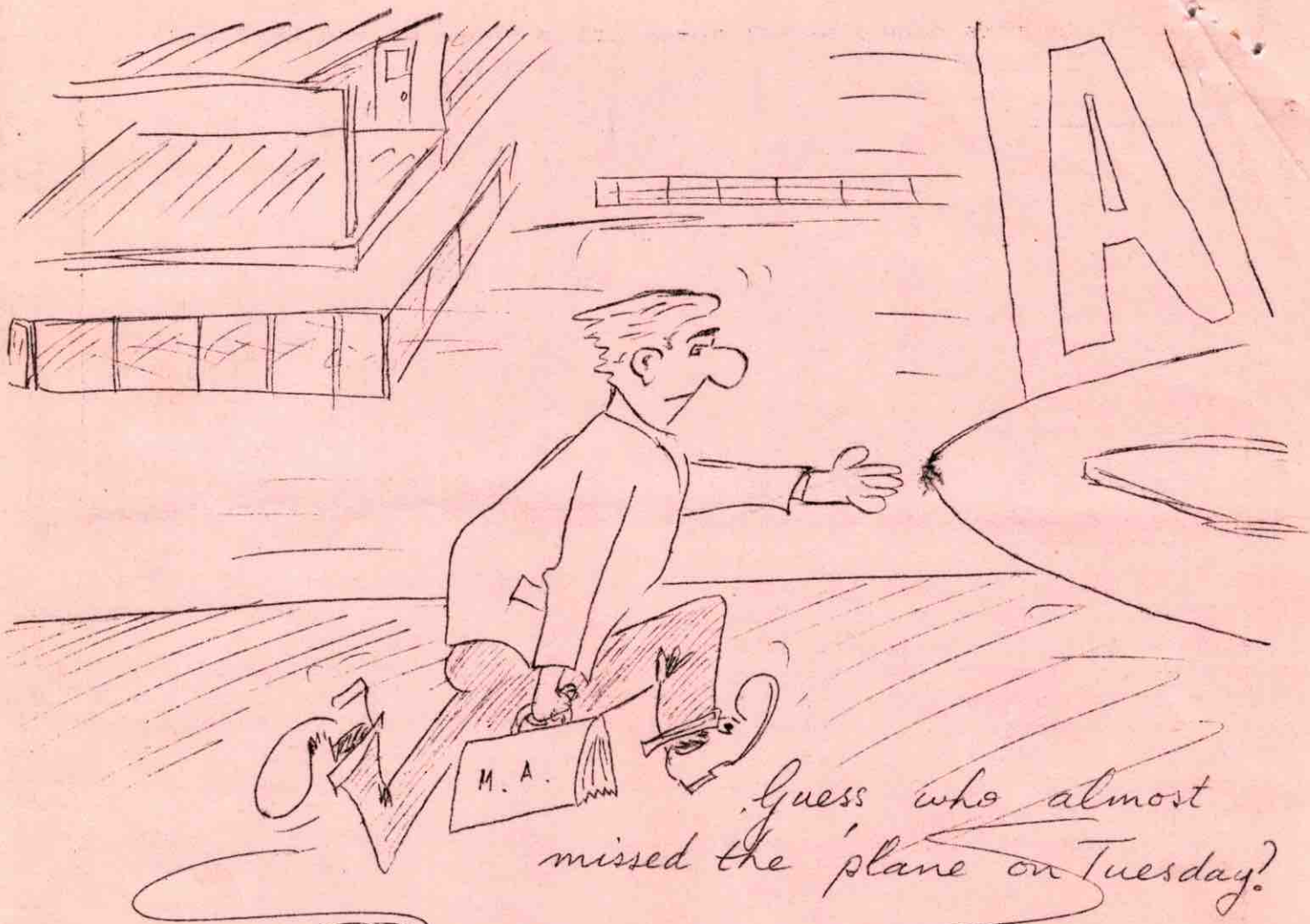

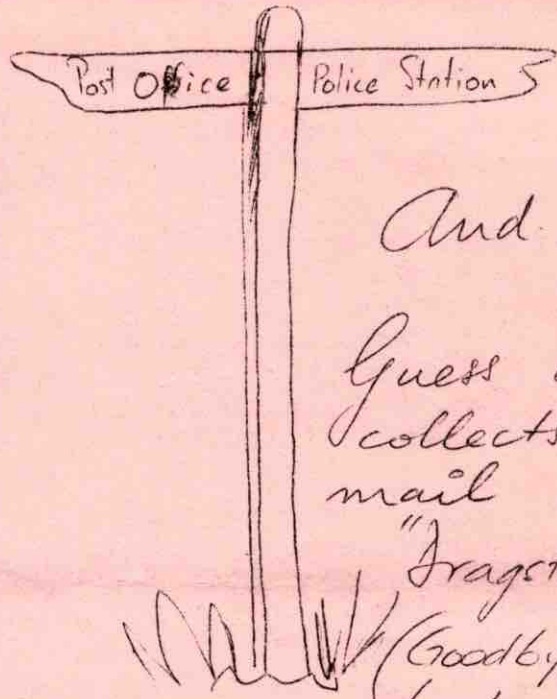
