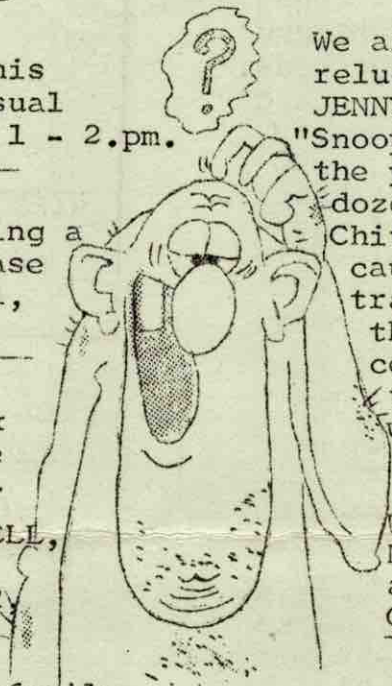
We extend CONGRATULATIONS to Mr Bernie SHAW on his recent appointment to Cashier, Leigh Creek.

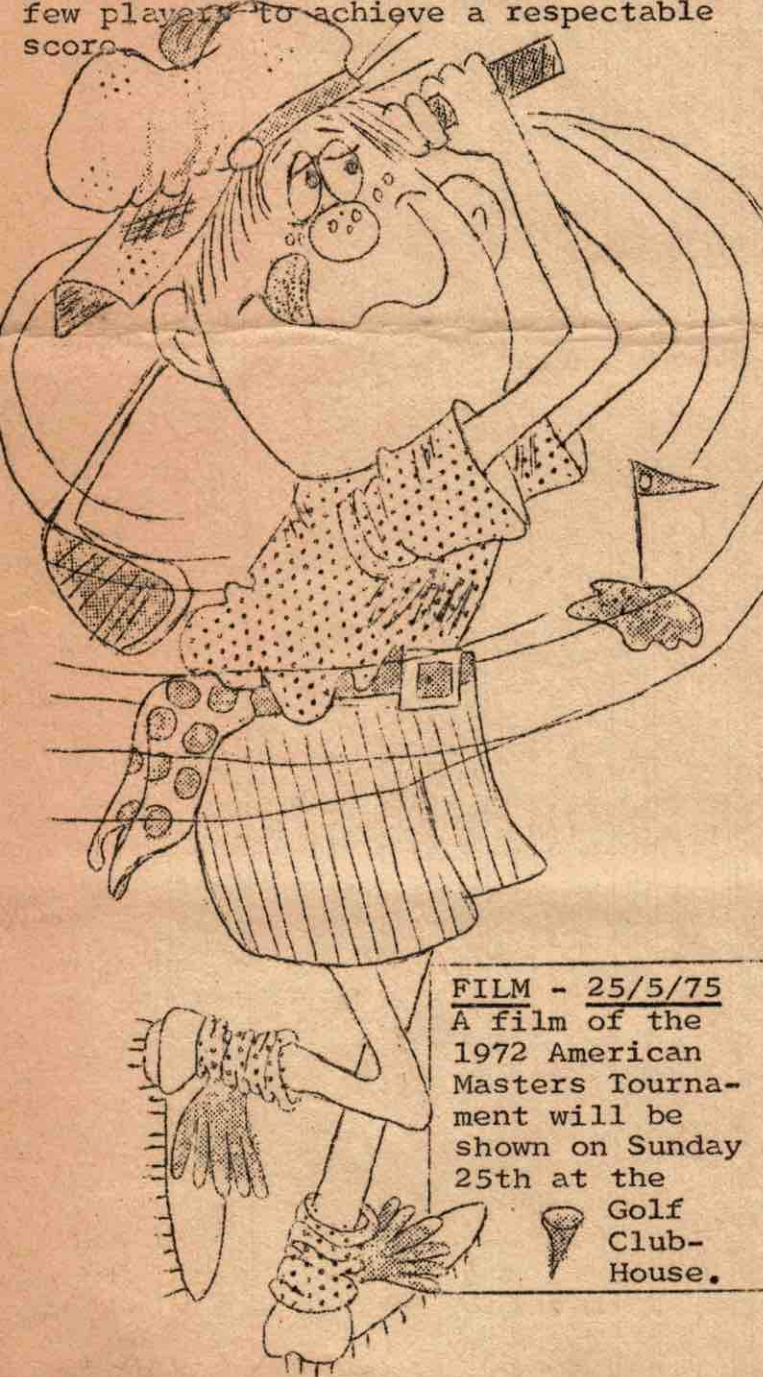
