


SWIMMING



WHAT IS A SCHOOL COMMITTEE ? ?

The 1971/72 committee year has been a year of great change. The most significant change was in the finance department. In the past committee expenditure was subsidised by the Education Department on a dollar for dollar basis for the bulk of its expenditure. This system has been abandoned and now the committee receives an annual grant which is calculated according to the number of children enrolled at the school. This has had the effect of reducing the committee's spending power but the committee appreciates that the new system has the effect of ensuring that schools in less fortunate areas get a more equitable share of government funds.

A further reduction in spending power was caused by a limitation placed on ground and oval maintenance expenditure. We now receive a grant of \$100 for this purpose instead of a dollar for dollar subsidy and this \$100 is well below half the actual expenditure.

These changes are fact and the committee has tried to reduce their effect by additional fund raising efforts to ensure that school needs are met and the committee wishes to acknowledge the help it has received from friends and benefactors in doing this.

Because the committee administers government money its constitution is laid down in an act of parliament. As a result of the Karmel report on education this constitution is undergoing changes some of which will take the effect after the Annual General Meeting on THURSDAY, MARCH 16. I invite you to attend the A.G.M. to hear what these changes are and find out what a school committee will be.

The committee commenced its financial year with about \$900 carried over and will end up with an approximate spending power of about \$2500. The reason for accummulating funds is to cover the cost of an improvement to the oval watering system, costing about \$300, to give more efficient coverage of the oval and a \$1900 air conditioning project for the new library. Unfortunately both projects must have Public Buildings Department approval and dealings with the PBD are invariably surrounded by procrastimation and red tape. It is confidently hoped that this work will be undertaken soon to provide basic comforts and amenities for our children.

The committee has budgeted the full amount for both projects but hopes the Government will meet half the cost. If this happens then funds will be released to fill some of the gaps on the library shelf now filled with hot air. Some of the things the committee had done in its term are, provide sporting equipment (including 50 hurdles) reading aids, ground maintenance, audio-visual aids, improved drinking facilities in the infant block and dripheating equipment. Two other achievements due inpart to this committee and previous committees are the re-establishment of the school dental service and convincing the Education Department that it should pay all maintance on air coolers. The latter has traditionally been a drain on committee funds and in some way off sets the loss of Departmental aid in other directions. Some matters for discussion at the AGM will be future committee activities and methods of fund raising, what are your views? Do you care? Don't sound-off to a friend in the Canteen or over the fence; come along to the AGM at the school on THURSDAY, MARCH 16. Films will be shown for the children.



The competitions were "An Apron to be sold at Flinders House Stall.





The following letter was forwarded to the Far Northern Development Ass., from Mr C R Kelly, Member for Wakefield.

"Dear Mr Kelly,

The Minister for Works, Senator the Hon. R C Wright, has asked me to inform you as Member for the Electorate of Wakefied that a contract has been let for the resealing of the Apron, Taxiways and Run-ways at the Leigh Creek Aerodrome at a cost of \$78,028-00. The Contractor is Spraypave Pty Ltd of Adelaide and the work is due for completion in April, 1972.

The work comprised the complete resealing of the two main runways and the taxiway and apron area fronting the Aerodrome Terminal and will involve the spreading and compacting of a bituminous sealing coat over an area of approximately 300 acres.

The work was documented by Engineers of the Commonwealth Department of Works, who will also supervise construction.



queries YOUR ROAD SENSE

Leigh Creek Town has been remarkably free from serious accidents on the roads. This has resulted from the extreme care that is exercised by a large number of drivers and from the extreme amount of LUCK that some drivers, cyclists and pedestrians enjoy. Sooner later someone is going to run out of luck.

PEDESTRIANS
Footpaths are maintained in a reasonable condition but are ignored by a large number of pedestrians who will wander down the road in groups of three or four abreast and make no attempt to clear the road for vehicles which are often forced to travel on the right side of the road to get past.

Many children wander alone and play on the roads. It is the parents responsibility to teach children road sense and unless they are taught, and set an example by adults, their lives are in danger.

CYCLISTS

The pedal bicycle is a cheap means of transport. There is no minimum age to ride them, no drivers licence needed and no registration or insurance paid.

Persons riding bicycles are required to travel as close as practicable to the left side of the road, they are not permitted to ride more than two abreast or ride on footpaths. Signals MUST be given when about to turn right or left and are governed by the same road rules as any other road user.

Any bicycle ridden between sundown and sunrise must be equipped with head and tail lights plus a red reflector at the rear.

Many children and teenagers either do not know or just disregard the rules of the road.


Once more it is the parents responsibility to instruct their children on road rules and to make sure that they obey them. Parents are also responsible to make sure that if their childrens' bicycles are ridden at night that they are equipped with lights that work. Just how long since we have had a good look at the brakes, bells etc on the bikes of our children?
