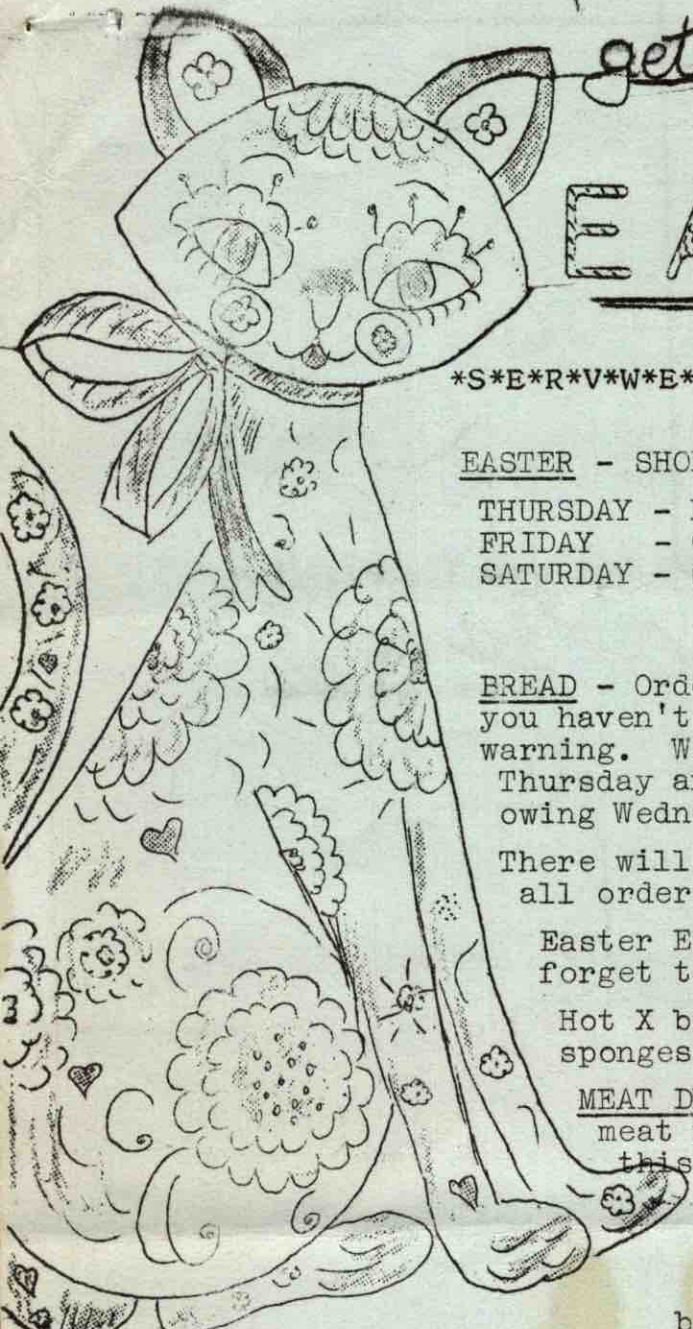

If this is the attitude held by the majority of intending players it is not worth the effort of those few willing to work to take any further action.

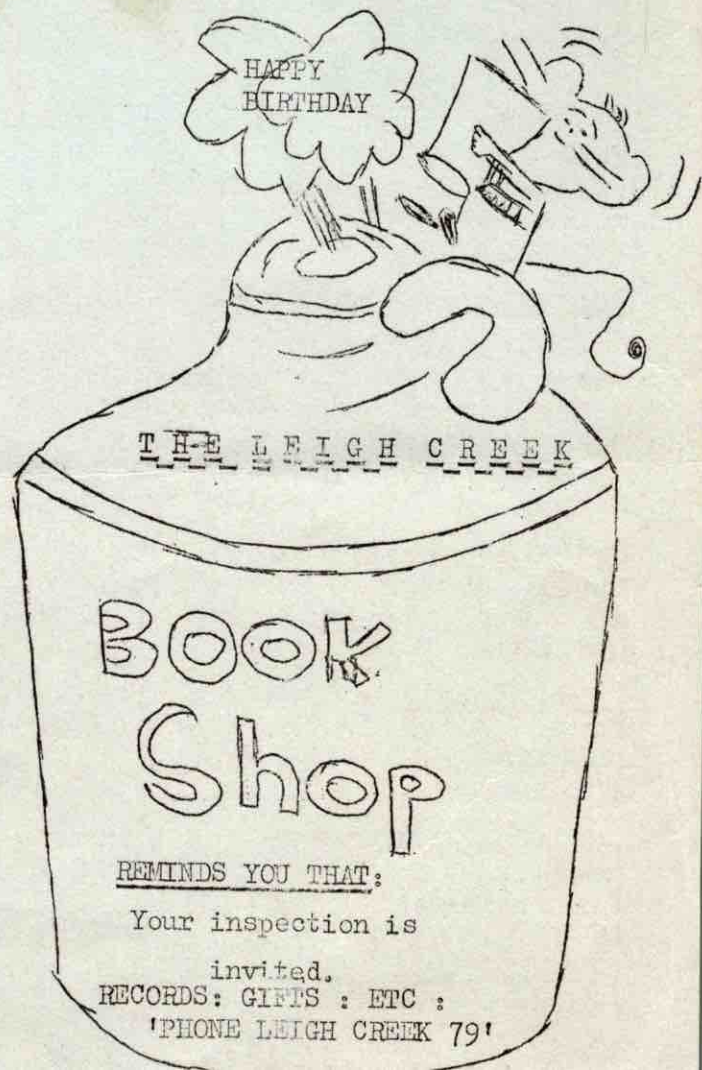
