
**CWA CWA CWA CWA REPORT**



# Green Thumb

The cold months are here to stay so get the winter vegetables going. Bush and climbing peas are great producers giving good yields over long periods. Caulies, Cabbages and Brocoli can also be planted now. Quick returns can be had from radish, while lettuce of the winter growing varieties should be selected from this point on.

All these vegies are well worth growing and good yields can be had for a minimum of effort. They all like well dug soils, rich in organic matter, so if you can obtain farmyard manure of the sheep or cattle variety, these are extra good. The sewer farm produces a degraded material that is also good for soil conditioning.

Dig these in well with frequent watering while the seedlings grow. Peas and radish can be planted direct into the soil, but lettuce, cabbages and caulies are better grown to seedling stage then transplanted.

Orders will be placed for BULBS in a weeks time. Catalogues can be borrowed from PAM LEPA or PETER SHOOTER.

Bulbs are best planted in May and June, so get the gardens prepared and lets have some showy blooms for the GARDEN COMPETITION in spring.

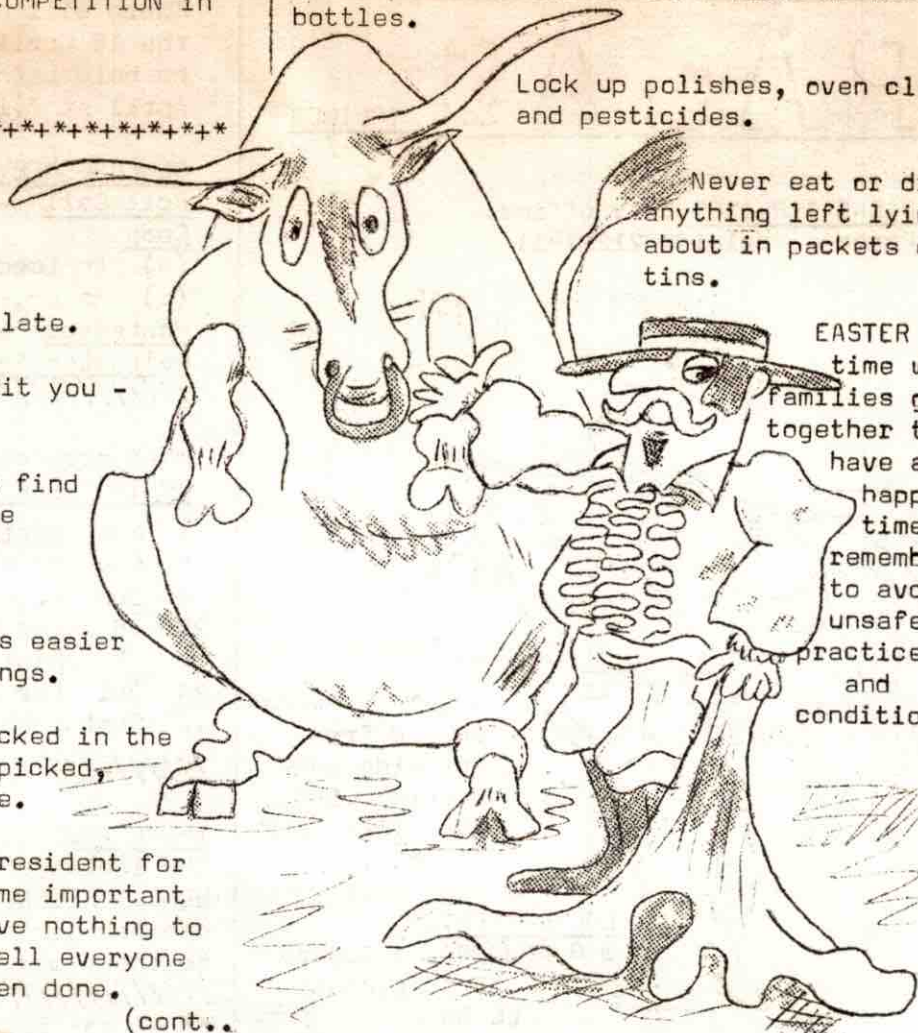

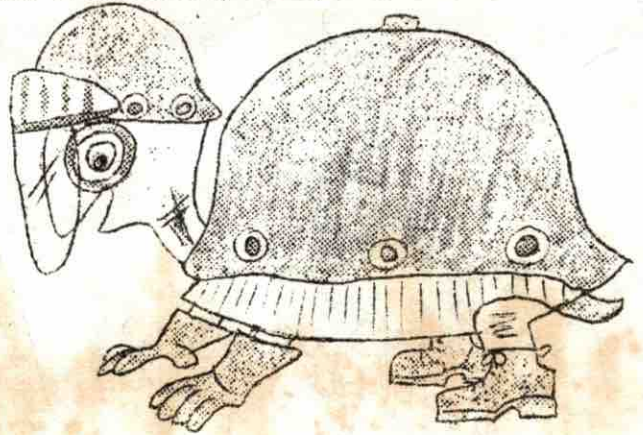

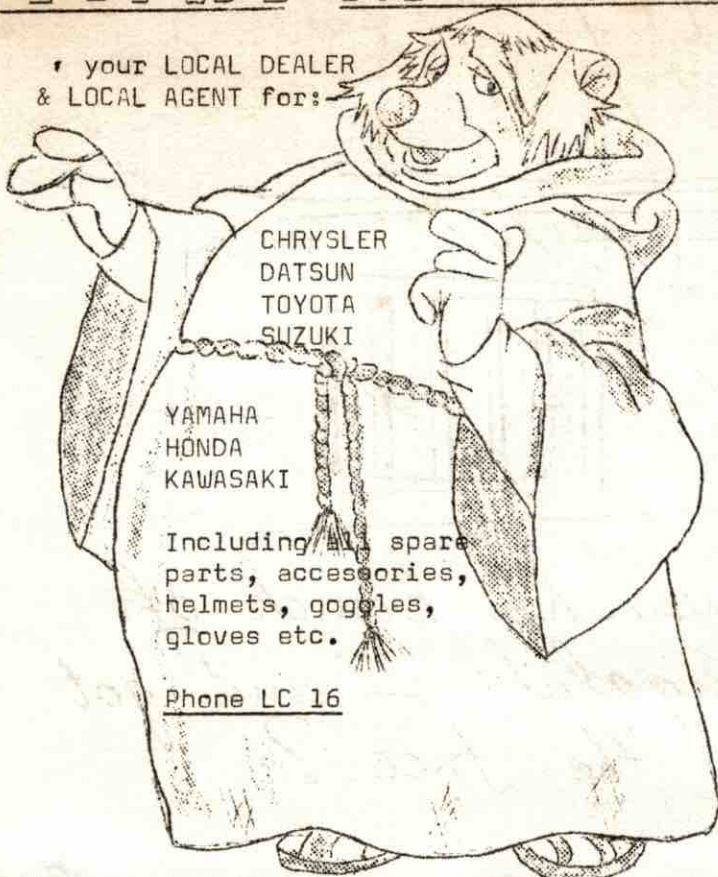
