




RUBBISH




Competitions: For an unusual cork several novelties were entered while there were also some very nice handmade articles received in the second section for Flinders House Fete.





The Pre-school kinder-

garten was first opened

in September 1954, by

Mrs Shirley KNOTT and

Lois TAYLOR and was
housed in the backstage dressing room
of the old Community Hall; Chairs
were borrowed from the Sunday School
and toys were begged from interested
townspeople. The two lady teachers
gave their time and energies for the
price of small contributions from
attending children. During the following Xmas holidays, the Electricity
Trust commenced what has become an
annual and much appreciated grant,
which has served to keep the Kindergarten on a firm basis; this has been
greatly added to by the fund raising
activities of the committees and
teachers over the years.

In 1955, Mrs Paule CHMIELEWSKI took over from Mrs Taylor with Mrs Knott's assistance and the kindergarten acquired its own brightly lacquered chairs. When Mrs Chmielewski left for Maitland, Mrs Knott assumed responsibility for the work and with the most capable help of Mrs Muriel WILKINSON continued with the good work.

The move to the old Canteen building in 1959 was a temporary measure until the move into the present fine new permanent rooms and washrooms (1961).

Over the years, the parents have worked hard to provide indoor and outdoor equipment. The playground with swings, sandpit and lawns is much enjoyed by the children, while inside they find much to occupy them with blocks, trucks, dolls, painting, modelling and many other activities.

Mrs GLADY MILLER is now in her 10th year having joined the kindergarten staff in 1964.

On looking through the 1st roll book we find these four names in the first year of kindergarten - TERRY BLIESCHKE, NEVIL MCPHERSON, JUNE MILLER and JENNY KNOTT.

In reply to your letter of 21 February, 1974, I advise that the present proposal, which is subject to finance, is that construction of the Hawker-Marree Road will commence from Hawker, northwards, following the completion of the construction of the road from Hawker to Wilpena.

It is anticipated that this work will commence late this year.

The upgrading of the Wirrealpa-Wertaloona Road, to an open surface standard, will not affect the priority of the Hawker-Marree Road.


