The change of season is an important time for the enthusiastic gardener. This is especially true in Leigh Creek where the hot months of late summer reduce our interest somewhat. Now the days are cooler, working in the garden is more appealing. Time to clean up and plant spring flowering seeds like calendulas, ice-land poppies, stocks, and lupins. These are best sown in a seed bed of good garden loam. Seeds planted now will produce good plants for planting out in a few weeks time.

In the vegetable garden, plant cabbages, chives, cauliflower, radish, peas (climbing and dwarf), winter lettuce, broad beans and silver beet.

Prepare the bed well, including a couple of handfulls of complete fertilizer per sq.yard. Cabbages and caulies should be sown in seed beds and planted out later, but plant peas, broad and raddish straight into their site.

As the plants mature, spread mulch around them to keep down the weeds and conserve water.
