

The work topic for this month is "LIQUID". Entries must be a picture of liquid in any shape, form or sine





The SA teams gained a 1st place in Free Pistol, 2 seconds in Air Pistol and Rapid Fire, and 3rd places in Standard Gun and Ladies Match.
